WATER

Team of six water and sanitation specialists in Cagayan de Oro working with Philippine Red Cross disaster management team to provide clear drinking water. This assistance has benefited around 16,000 people in five evacuation centers and neighboring residential areas.

To increase storage capacity, the ICRC and PRC teams set up water bladders and connected tap stands in five barangays (communities): Macasandig, Carmen, 1315, Kauswagan, and Consolacion.

EMERGENCY RELIEF

Donation of kits with essential household and hygiene items, and food kits, to the Philippine Red Cross chapters. This assistance covers 35,000 people.

- 3,100 kits for Cagayan de Oro
- 2,300 kits for Iligan
- 300 kits for Bukidnon

Similar relief items are on their way to PRC chapters, benefiting 4,200 people.

- 300 kits for Negros Oriental
- 400 kits for Surigao del Sur

HEALTH

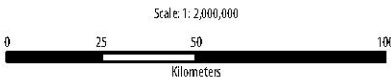
Two hospitals in Cagayan de Oro and Iligan received a total donation of 8,000 capsules of antibiotics.
