Rehabilited 10 health centres damaged by Cyclone Idai in 5 districts in central Mozambique (Dondo, Buzi, Nhamatanda, Mussorize and Sussundenga) to restore access to healthcare in rural communities.



119,219

119,219 people (23,844 families) have received seeds and agricultural tools to help them plant crops and rebuild their livelihoods in central Mozambique.



5

5 prisons in central Mozambique (Beira Central, Buzi, Chimoio, Nhamatanda and Savane) have been rehabilitated to improve living conditions for detainees after damage caused by Cyclone Idai. Detainees were also provided with 180 jerry cans, 45 tarpaulins, 3,600 units of chlorine, a kitchen as well as a hygiene kit.



10,000

Over 10,000 people were able to regain a regular water supply following the donation and installation of a generator in Espungabera town and the rehabilitation of 4 hand pumps in 4 districts in central Mozambique.



112,320

112,320 people (22,464 families) have received food assistance (cereals, cooking oil, beans and high energy biscuits) to meet their daily nutritional needs in coordination with the World Food Programme in central Mozambique.



104,805

104,805 (20,961 families) have been reached with tarpaulins, blankets and kitchen sets to meet their urgent shelter and household needs in central Mozambique.



2,028

Over 2,028 free phone calls have been provided to people separated from their families during Cyclone Idai seeking to reconnect with their loved ones in Mozambique, Malawi and Zimbabwe.



1,000,000

Over 1 million people benefitted from improved health care following the donation of medical and surgical items to hospitals and clinics in central Mozambique and eastern Zimbabwe.
