February - March 2019

In the months of February and March, the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) continued its life saving activities, relief projects and interventions on various fronts. The Water and Habitat department worked mainly on a multiplicity of projects across Yemen to ensure provision of water to local populations and to provide pertinent support to several hospitals, Health department continued its interventions in ICRC-supported hospitals, not only focusing on weapon wounded and trauma patients, but also leading a multidisciplinary cholera response, while the Economic Security department sustained its relief assistance through distributing food and agro-inputs (among others) to vulnerable communities and internally displaced people in the north and the south.

BETTER ACCESS TO HEALTHCARE AND MEDICAL FACILITIES

Regarding war wounded and trauma patients, the ICRC supported the following services aimed at ensuring access to high quality surgical services throughout the continuum of care:



■ 20 trauma stabilization/pre-hospital care facilities with medical supplies along the frontlines in Sa'ada and Hodeida, which provided first aid and stabilization services for a total of 1,666 weapon wounded patients.

21,550 PATIENTS

benefitted from emergency care out of which 877 were weapon wounded.

■ Emergency care and ad hoc support provided to 11 referral hospitals, among which 9 are close to the frontlines in 4 governorates (Taiz, Hodeida, Hadramout and Shabwa) and 2 in Amanat al-Asima, in order to ensure stabilization of war wounded and trauma patients and the provision of surgical care. Through this support, 21,550 patients received emergency care, out of which 877 were weapon wounded.

> 9 REFERRAL HOSPITALS received regular ICRC support in 7 governorates.

Regular support provided to 9 referral hospitals in 7 governorates with supply of drugs, medical consumables and equipment to ensure treatment for war wounded and trauma patients: Amanat al-Asima (3 hospitals), Marib, al Jawf, Dhamar, Ibb, Hodeida, and Shabwa. In these hospitals, a total of 83,522 patients received emergency care, out of which 2,617 were weapon wounded.



 ICRC surgical activities were maintained in 2 ICRC-supported hospitals: al-Talh (Sa'ada) and al-Mansoura (Aden). This ensured emergency care for 462 weapon wounded (230 in al-Talh and 232 in al-Mansoura). It also allowed inpatient surgical care for 346 admitted weapon wounded patients (184 in al-Talh and 162 in al-Mansoura), with a total of 922 surgeries performed (560 in al-Talh and 362 in al-Mansoura).

In addition to those 2 hospitals and following the rehabilitation of the Emergency Room, Operating Theatre, High Dependency Unit, and Surgical Inpatient Ward, the ICRC deployed a Mobile Surgical Team to Bajil Rural Hospital (Hodeida) and provided support in preparedness activities in case of mass casualties resulting from the ongoing hostilities in Hodeida.

To respond to the health needs of the civilian population affected by the conflict, the ICRC has supported the following essential preventive services and life-saving curative services:



- Regular medical assistance provided to 23 primary-health-care (PHC) centres in 9 governorates.
- In the 23 ICRC-supported PHCs across the country, 118,136 consultations were carried out, 42.7% (50,422) of which were for children under 5 years of age, 18,654 of whom received vaccines.
- 5,852 antenatal care consultations provided to pregnant women and 1,231 deliveries registered.
- Across the 23 supported facilities, 13,319 suspected cholera cases were received and 20 deaths due to cholera recorded (CFR 10.12%).
- A total of 5,716 consultations were provided to patients with non-communicable diseases (NCDs), mainly high blood pressure and diabetes.
- In order to ensure continuity of care for patients with NCDs, support was provided, with drugs and consumables, to 8 dialysis centres across the country in 7 governorates (Aden (2 centres), Mahaweet, Sana'a, Dhamar, Hajjah, Hodeida, and Shabwa). A total of 23,164 dialysis sessions were granted thanks to ICRC support.

Physical Rehabilitation Program (PRP):

A total of 7,070 persons received services from the ICRC-supported physical rehabilitation centers (PRCs) in Sana'a, Aden, Taiz, Mukalla and Sa'ada, including the delivery of 85 prostheses, 2,066 orthoses and physiotherapy sessions to 3,336 persons. During these two months, ICRC's PRP continued to provide staff incentives to Sa'ada and Taiz and fuel to Sa'ada, Taiz, Mukalla and Sana'a to ensure continuity of services to people with disabilities in Yemen.

The Diploma in Prosthetics and Orthotics course, delivered in collaboration with the High Institute of Health Sciences (HIHS), is continuing to run as planned. The 10 students (6 males and 4 females) are progressing with clinical and English language studies. The Diploma of Prosthetics and Orthotics is progressing in the second semester, to be completed after Ramadan. 5 first trans-tibial prosthetics have been delivered and all students participated successfully during these months. Local materials necessary for training have been purchased and delivered to HIHS.

SUPPORT TO VULNERABLE COMMUNITIES AND INTERNALLY DISPLACED PEOPLE

Several relief interventions were carried out, in the north, but also in the south. In total, 13,534 internally displaced people (IDPs) and vulnerable host families (94,738 individuals) were reached with assistance in these two months.

RELIEF ASSISTANCE (FOOD AND ESSENTIAL HOUSEHOLD ITEMS)

- In Baqim district, Sa'ada governorate, a second round of food distribution was carried out for almost 3,000 HHs (21,000 individuals) by the end of the quarter, including 200 newly displaced households. Similarly, 1,200 marginalized families were given food rations for a third and last round in Sa'ada city.
- In Hajjah, ICRC made a donation of 132 food rations to YRCS Hajjah branch which were distributed to new IDPs from Abs in Hajjah city. In March, we also delivered food and other items, such as hygiene parcels, blankets, buckets, jerry cans, etc. to the YRCS Hajjah branch to assist 1,640 IDPs who had fled from the fighting in Kushar to Khayran al-Muharraq district. In addition, a field trip to assess the newly displaced families in Haydan district was conducted
- In al-Dhale' governorate 1,750 displaced households in Qa'atabah district and Muris subdistrict received food and essential household items. In addition, 2,022 vulnerable host families were given food rations in al-Azariq district with the support of the YRCS.

FOOD PRODUCTION

■A project targeting 400 female-headedhouseholds in Lahj and Abyan governorates with seeds and agro-inputs for kitchen gardens, which was initiated during Q4 in 2018, was implemented by the end of Q1 in 2019. A fourday training for the beneficiaries was carried out through the MoAI in March. In total, 8 trainers

conducted 2 training sessions of 4 days in each district. On average, 25 beneficiaries attended each training. The distribution of seeds and agro-inputs is planned to be finalized during the first week of April and will be carried out by the Ministry of Agriculture staff jointly with Lahj and Abyan YRCS volunteers.

STRUCTURAL SUPPORT

- The ICRC discussed and agreed with the Rusabha farm manager that we will phase out after the last donation of fodder and drugs. Based on that, the last shipment of extra concentrated fodder (21,000 kg maize, 40 kg salt block EA, 200 kg milk powder replacer, 300 kg phosphorus, 9000 kg soya beans and 28,800 kg buck wheat) was given in March.
- 4,500 sachets of plumpy sup were donated to the al-Fakeeka Health Centre, an ICRC-supported PHC in Maqbanah district, Taiz governorate. In addition, the al-Takaful Social Center in Aden City received a donation of 45 school bags.
- ■100 hygienic parcels and 3,870 garbage plastic bags were donated to the Central Prison in Ibb governorate in response to the reported cholera outbreak. Moreover, donation of cleaning and

kitchen materials for Sana'a Central Prison was also made (40 boots and heavy-duty plastic rubber, 50 dust protecting masks, 5 cooking pots, 400 litres with handles and lid, 50 scrubbing brush brooms).

Cleaning materials were donated to the cleaning fund office of Rada'a district of al-Baidha

governorate as an emergency response to remove the piled garbage in order to prevent the further spread of cholera. The donated materials consisted of 5,000 plastic bags, 100 plastic boots and 300 gloves.

WATER, SANITATION & CONSTRUCTION

ICRC's Water and Habitat department continued its neutral and impartial support to the Yemeni population.

In Abyan

■ In Khanfer al-Atef, ICRC donated one submersible pump with accessories to the local committee in al-Atef village to rehabilitate the water supply projects in the villages. Beneficiaries: 1,500 individuals.

In Aden governorate

- In Aden al-Mansoura Hospital (45 Beds), ICRC supplied and installed a new generator 100 kVA.
- In al-Mansoura Stadium, ICRC supplied and installed four water tanks 2,000 litres in capacity to provide safe drinking water for the Ethiopian refugees. Beneficiaries: around 3,000 refugees.

In al-Baydah governorate

- In al-Baydah Water and Sanitation Local Cooperation, ICRC donated two air filters, five oil filters, three fuel filters, one engine belt, and 100 litres of lubricant oil. Beneficiaries: 28,000 individuals.
- In Rada'a Water and Sanitation Local Cooperation, ICRC donated eight air filters, 20 oil filters, 12 fuel filters, four engine belts, and 1,970 litres of lubricant oil. Beneficiaries: 57,827 individuals.

In al-Dhale' governorate

- In al-Morkoula villages, ICRC supported existing water systems and rehabilitated the distribution water networks, and the ground masonry water tank. Moreover, ICRC connected the submersible pump to the overhead transmission electrical grid line. Beneficiaries: 1,027 individuals.
- In al-Domna villages, ICRC supported existing water systems and rehabilitated the distribution water networks, the ground masonry water tank. Moreover, ICRC connected the submersible pump and rehabilitated the generator set. Beneficiaries: 3,008 individuals.
- In al-Zanad village, ICRC supported the existing water system by equipping it with a borehole no 2, with new pump and generator set and connecting the borehole to the main overhead electrical grid line and building a water tank to cover the peak hourly demand. Beneficiaries: 3,018 individuals.
- In al-Dhale' al-Nassar Hospital (40 beds), ICRC supplied and installed one morgue for the hospital.

In Hadramout governorate

 In al-Mukalla Ibn Sina Hospital (40 beds), ICRC supplied and installed one morgue for the hospital.

In Hajjah governorate

- In Hajjah city, ICRC completed the additional work construction of YRCS' third floor extension.
- In Hajjah Water and Sanitation Local Corporation, ICRC supplied and delivered oil and spare parts to ensure sustainable supply of safe drinking water. Beneficiaries: 107,000 individuals.

In Hodeida governorate

- As part of the agreement signed between the ICRC and the Ministry of Public Health in Population (MoPHP) in March 2019, the ICRC supported Bajil Rural Hospital (40 beds) through the rehabilitation of the water supply and sewage evacuation systems and garbage collection. The ICRC renovated the Emergency Room, Operating Theatre, High Dependency Unit, and Surgical Inpatient Ward. In addition, the ICRC supplied and installed the following: Electrical submersible pump and 300 kVA generator, incl. civil, electrical works and main earthing system. The main electrical distribution system was supplied and installed, and the fire alarm system for the medical store building.
- In close cooperation with the Water and Sanitation Local Corporation in Bajil, the ICRC completed the pumping test for four wells in addition to supplying and installing UPVC pipes for another well. In Bait al-Faqih, the ICRC donated 30 12-inch heavy PVC pipes for the newly drilled borehole and conducted pumping test in close cooperation with the Water and Sanitation Local Corporation. The project is expected to support 60'000 individuals.
- In Hodeida City, the ICRC completed the setup of 22 emergency water points in mosques in close cooperation with the Water and Sanitation Local Corporation and the Ministry of Endowment and Religious Guidance. These water points serve as backup in case of interruption of the city's water supply. Expected beneficiaries 15,000 individuals.
- In Zabid, the ICRC donated two submersible pumps, UPVC pipes, and valves to the Water and Sanitation Local Corporation to the benefit of some 42'000 individuals.



Two generators were delivered by the ICRC to al-Mudhafar Hospital in Taiz, one 150 kVA generator and one 60 kVA generator as emergency support after the two existing ones were totally destroyed.

In Amran governorate

■ In Amran Water Supply and Sanitation Local Corporation, ICRC donated 27 air filters, 86 oil filters, 109 fuel filters, 24 batteries, and 6,656 litres of lubricant oil to ensure sustainable supply for the safe drinking water. Beneficiaries: 70,000 individuals.

In Sa'ada governorate

In Sa'ada al-Talh Rural Hospital, ICRC renovated al-Talh Rural Hospital by constructing of shade for waiting area and by constructing X-ray room. Moreover, additional workshop tools and spare parts were donated.

In Dhamar governorate

- In Dhamar Water Sanitation Local Cooperation, ICRC donated 38 air filters, 65 oil filters, 92 fuel filters, 21 engine belts, and 3,025 litres of lubricant oil to ensure safe water access to 280,000 individuals. Also, ICRC delivered 396,400 of chlorine tablets (1000mg, NaDDC 167 mg multipurpose).
- In Dhamar General Hospital (300 beds). ICRC donated four air filters, 10 oil filters, six fuel filters, two engine belts, and 590 litres of lubricant oil to ensure sustainable energy supply.

In Amanat al-Asima

- In Sana'a Wastewater Treatment Plant, ICRC donated one computer desktop 500 G1, Intel Core-i7, 4GB, 1000GB. Beneficiaries: 1 employee
- In Sana'a Water and Sanitation Local Corporation, ICRC donated 226 air filters, 464 oil filters, 399 fuel filters, 58 engine belts, and 12,214 litres of lubricant oil. Beneficiaries: 1,500,000 individuals.
- In a place of detention, ICRC donated two air filters, five oil filters, three fuel filters, one engine belt, and 260 litres of lubricant oil. Moreover, the ICRC-supported cholera response campaign was completed successfully including, the cleaning campaign that was implemented by 20 YRCS volunteers and the distribution of cleaning items, protective materials and kitchen items to support detainees' health.
- In a place of detention, ICRC supplied and installed portable toilets and showers. ICRC donated 200 litres of diesel in order to conduct the final test of the systems. All tests done were successful.

- In Sana'a Typical Police Hospital (150 beds), ICRC conducted maintenance for two generators. Furthermore, ICRC donated six air filters, 15 oil filters, nine fuel filters, three engine belts, and 1'095 litres of lubricant oil.
- In a place of detention, ICRC donated one 250 kVA generator.
- In Sana'a al-Kuwait Hospital (320 beds), ICRC's work started for a bakery installation project.
- In Sana'a al-Jumhouri Hospital (575 beds), ICRC donated six air filters, 15 oil filters, 18 fuel filters, three engine belts, and 1,490 litres of lubricant oil to ensure sustainable energy supply.

In Sana'a governorate

■ In al-Haimah al-Kharjiah al-Sabt Health Center, ICRC donated one protective equipment and 12,000 chlorine tablets. Beneficiaries: 15,000 individuals.

In Mareb governorate

■ In Mareb Military Hospital (40 beds), ICRC donated one morgue.

In Lahj governorate

■ In al-Hawtah Local Water and Sanitation Corporation, ICRC supplied and installed IT equipment: fast billing printer.

In Taiz governorate

- In Taiz city, ICRC completed painting the pump room for al-Jamea pumping station.
- In Taiz Public Health Center, ICRC donated and delivered spray materials.
- In Taiz Water and Sanitation Local Corporation, ICRC delivered 80 manhole covers.
 Moreover, as emergency support, 50,000 litres of fuel were donated. Beneficiaries: 400,000 individuals.
- In Taiz al-Mudhafar Hospital (500 beds), ICRC delivered one 150 kVA generator and 60 kVA generator as emergency support after the two existing ones were totally destroyed.
- In Taiz al-Jumhouri Hospital (500 beds), ICRC donated chlorine tablets for cholera response in the hospital.
- In Taiz Physical Rehabilitation Center ICRC repaired the temporary roof: Beneficiaries: 80 consultations per day.

PROTECTION

DETENTION

Between February and March, the ICRC carried out a humanitarian response in various places of detention across Sa'ada, Sana'a and Hodeida governorates, benefitting around 6,000 persons deprived of liberty. The ICRC's response also included health, water and sanitation activities to respond to a reported risk of cholera cases. Moreover, 2 detention visits were conducted in Dhamar governorate.

In Hodeida City, the ICRC started the delivery of wheat flour bags for a two-month period to support a place of detention. A total of 7,000 kgs of wheat flour was distributed during the month of March.

PROTECTION OF THE CIVILIAN POPULATION (PCP)

The ICRC continued receiving first-hand information from victims or/and eyewitnesses on alleged violations of International Humanitarian Law (IHL) during the conduct of hostilities between warring parties. With a view of ensuring respect for civilians and civilian essential infrastructure and improving behavior of arm carriers, these allegations of IHL violations were presented to the presumed perpetrators through a confidential and bilateral dialogue.

Furthermore, the ICRC has delivered emergency assistance to some of the victims of IHL violations or has referred them to other organizations for support.

RESTORING FAMILY LINKS (RFL)

The ICRC registered 40 persons who have been separated from their families due to the current conflict. The fates of 14 sought persons, who went missing due to the conflict, were clarified. The ICRC also assisted families living in Yemen to restore contact with their relatives detained

abroad, by facilitating the exchange of 20 Red Cross messages. In addition, vulnerable migrants in Yemen were able to restore contact with their families through the exchange of 521 Red Cross messages (230 collected and 291 distributed) and 99 Safe and Well messages. Furthermore, 26 tracing forms were collected (information collected on a missing person) as part of our restoring family links activities.

FORENSIC ACTIVITIES

In the aftermath of the Stockholm process, a meeting with representatives of concerned parties was held in Amman in February. As a result, the sub-committee on dead bodies was formed and the ICRC – in its role as a neutral intermediary – was appointed as chair member. The ICRC maintained regular contact with all representatives of concerned parties to support the implementation of the action plan agreed in Amman. The forensic unit facilitated the donation of 220 body bags, 220 tags, 440 tie wraps and 15 retrieval kits to stakeholders that are responsible for the handling of the deceased. Several meetings were also held, both in Sana'a and in Aden, with respective forensic specialists.

COMMUNICATION & PROMOTION OF INTERNATIONAL HUMANITARIAN LAW

To highlight the massive humanitarian needs in Yemen and to promote International Humanitarian Law, the following activities were implemented:

- Produced a one-minute radio spot about raising awareness on the ICRC, its mandate and activities in Yemen to be aired in May.
- Gave a dozen TV /radio interviews to regional, local and international media outlets.
- Arranged several photo missions and produced audio-visual materials showcasing the dire humanitarian needs in Yemen. The material was shared on ICRC's global and Yemen-specific social media platforms.
- Carried out 23 sessions about the ICRC and IHL targeting different audiences including fighters, government officials, community leaders, Is-lamic circles and IDPs and vulnerable communities benefitting from relief provision.
- Supported the YRCS branches in 14 governorates across Yemen in carrying out 140 operational communication sessions about the fundamental principles of the Red Cross and Red Crescent.
- Carried out, in close cooperation with Kamaran

Foundation for Development and Humanitarian works, an H1N1 campaign to raise awareness, of 81'000 students in 41 schools across the capital Sana'a, on how to protect themselves from H1N1.

WEAPON CONTAMINATION (WEC)

The safety booklets which pertain to weapon contamination were delivered to all sub-delegations. Moreover, in collaboration and coordination with our colleagues in the Health department, Weapon Con-

tamination (WeC) department donated medical supplies, which included drugs and medical consumables, to YEMAC. These items are fundamental for the provision of initial medical services to demining teams.

COOPERATION WITH THE YEMEN RED CRESCENT SOCIETY (YRCS)

COOPERATION

The ICRC supported 14 YRCS branches. In particular, the ICRC's support allowed the YRCS to

- Provide First Aid and hospital transfer to 784 weapon wounded patients.
- Retrieve human remains of 46 persons.
- Deliver First Aid training to 160 volunteers and community members.
- Provide Mine Risk Education (MRE) sessions to 15,857 beneficiaries.
- Deliver 12,517 food parcels and 500 non-food items.

ACTIVITIES REPORTED BY RED CROSS AND **RED CRESCENT MOVEMENT PARTNERS**

INTERNATIONAL FEDERATION OF RED CROSS AND RED CRESCENT SOCIETIES (IFRC)

IFRC supported the YRCS to:

- Provide water trucking to 31 installed water points in Sana'a Capital, Amran, Dhamar, and Hajjah targeting 25,921 IDPs and vulnerable people (Dhamar 4,270, Amran 3,660, Hajjah 7,427, and Sana'a 10,564).
- Distribute hygiene kits (1 jerry can, 2 Clorox cleaning agents, 100 chlorine tablets, 6 soaps and 4 hand sanitizers) to 4,288 families in 12 water point areas (Dhamar 3,370 and Amran 918) during a hygiene promotion campaign.
- Distribute 2,899 school bags to children in Amran, Sana'a and Dhamar.

DANISH RED CROSS (DRC):

DRC supported the YRCS to:

- Provide water trucking to 28 installed water points in Mahaweet targeting 36,000 IDPs and vulnerable people.
- Conduct primary health services training for the health staff in Hodeida and Aden health facilities targeting 20 health staff.
- Conduct basic health and communication skills training for the community health committees CHCs in Aden targeting areas with total beneficiaries 33 persons (21 males & 12 females).
- Supply the medicines to the YRCS branches in Hodeida, Mahaweet and Sana'a warehouses to be distributed to 86,000 beneficiaries.

GERMAN RED CROSS (GRC) GRC supported the YRCS to:

- Support the health facilities in Hajjah, Amran and Taiz with essential drugs, solution and running costs, incentive for the staff, fuel and oxygen through YRCS reaching around 34,647 beneficiaries.
- Provide services to 1,024 beneficiaries through mobile clinic services in Maqbana district.
- Provide water trucking on a daily basis to 46 points in Amran, Hajjah, Sana'a Capital and Sana'a governorate distributing around 13,290,000 litres of clean water and reaching 25,500 beneficiaries
- Provide 221,000 litres of clean water to a disability center in Sana'a.

QATAR RED CRESCENT SOCIETY (QRCS) :

- ■QRCS has supported 27 health facilities (hospitals and health centers) through: providing medicines & medical supplies, medical tools & equipment, providing incentives, training, referral, health awareness, water & fuel and other operational expenses in four governorates (Taiz, Hodeida, Amanat al-Asima, Al Dhale'). These health facilities provided primary and emergency health care to a number of beneficiaries, as follows:
 - · Total number of outpatient medical consultations is 85,265
 - · Total number of consultations for communicable diseases including outbreaks is 15,975 cases.
 - · Total number of consultations for new hypertensive patients is 11,189 cases.
 - · Total number of trauma cases which received life support (emergency care) is 4,043 cases.
 - Total number of children under 5 years with severe acute malnutrition treated (SAM) is 1,522 cases.
 - · Total number of children under 1 who received Penta3 is 2,573 cases.
 - Total number of beneficiaries of reproductive health care services is 20,434 cases (antenatal care: 14,395, postnatal care: 5,377, C-section: 31, and normal deliveries: 667).
 - Total number of beneficiaries of the kidney dialysis center in al-Jumhouri Hospital in Taiz which conducted 469 kidney dialysis sessions last month (326 female and 143 male).
