We also improve water provision and sanitation, reunite families and strengthen health-care services for the wounded and sick, including victims of sexual violence.

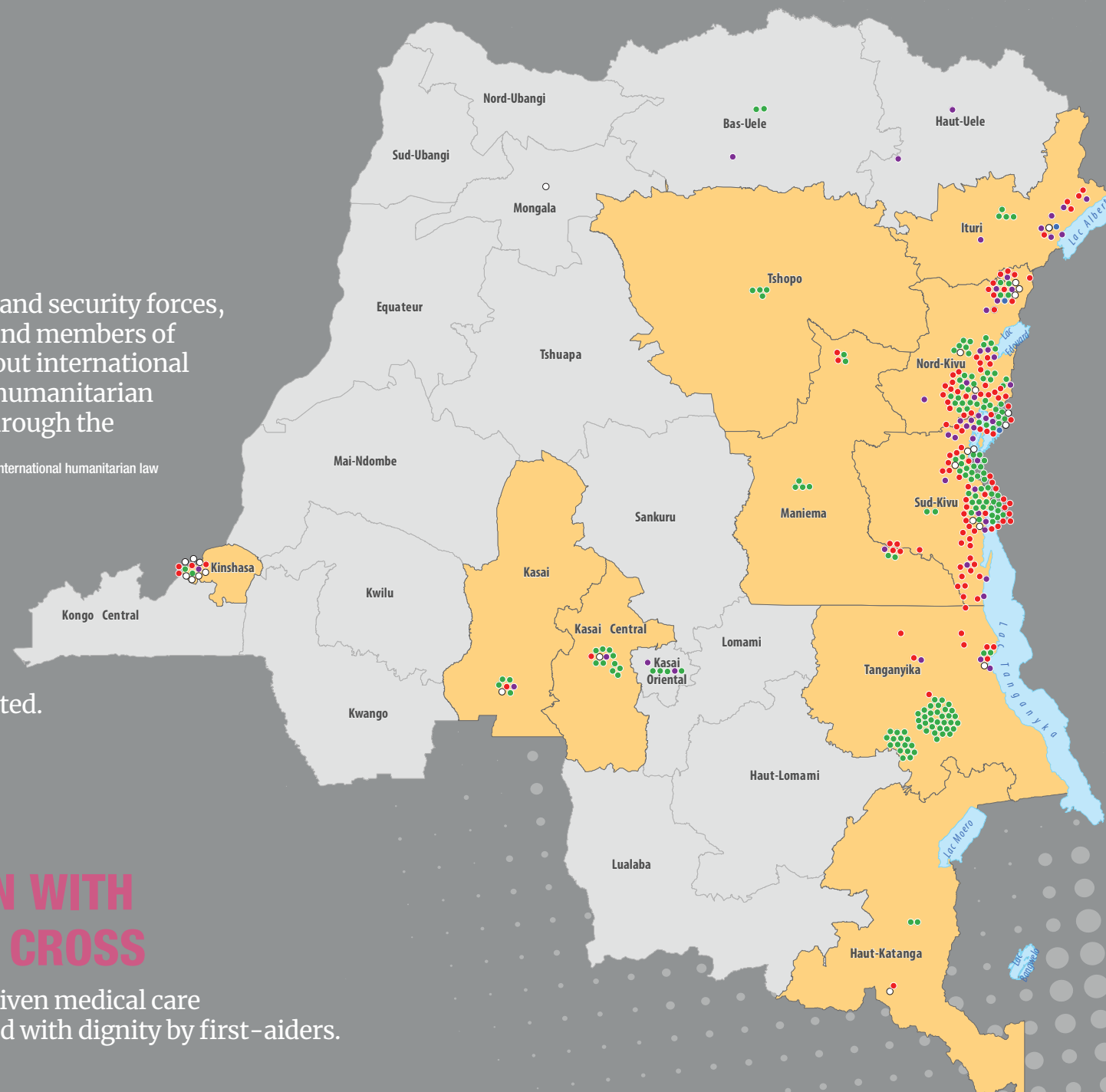
