HOSPITALS & PRIMARY HEALTH CARE FACILITIES



HEALTH FACILITIES

(30 Primary Health Care facilities & 14 hospitals) were supported by the ICRC on a regular basis with medical supplies, weapon wounded kits, PPE materials, and medical equipments.



CONSULTATIONS

(845,461 in Primary Health Care facilities & 478,662 in hospitals) were carried out in the PHCs and hospitals supported by the ICRC.



ANTENATAL CARE

consultations were provided in ICRC-supported health facilities.



DELIVERIES

were carried out in the PHCs and hospitals supported by the ICRC (8,853 deliveries in the PHCs and 4,506 deliveries in the hospitals).



ADMISSIONS

were treated in the 39 hospitals supported on ad hoc basis.



SERVICES

were conducted in the Red Cross COVID-19 Care Center based in Aden (330 consultations - 101 admissions - 51 referrals to ICU - 294 COVID tests).



SURGERIES

were performed in all hospitals supported by the ICRC.



HOSPITALS

were supported with weapon wounded kits and PPE materials on an ad hoc basis.

INFRASTRUCTURE IMPROVEMENTS TO HEALTH FACILITIES



ELECTRICAL RENOVATIONS

were conducted in 8 health facilities including rehabilitating substation building, supplying and installing solar systems and ACs, and replacing electrical panels and cables.





GENERATORS

were donated by the ICRC in 9 health facilities with a total power of 2,140 kVA. The ICRC also donated lubricant oil and spare parts to 16 health facilities to ensure reliable electricity production.



HEALTH FACILITIES

benefited from the constructions and rehabilitations done by the ICRC in operating room, X-ray room, etc.



OXYGEN CYLINDERS

were donated by the ICRC. The ICRC also installed a medical oxygen station in Al Kuwait Hospital.

WATER SYSTEMS

were improved in 6 health facilities, with providing water, maintaining water treatment stations, donating water tanks, and rehabilitating water networks.



CHLORINE TABLETS

were donated to 11 health facilities, along with chlorine maker, chlorine powder, cleaning kits, cholera response kits to some health facilities in term of disinfection support.



MORGUES

renovation in 3 hospitals, (transferring the morgue building, replacing and installing new compressor, installing morgue refrigerator container).

TRAINING AND OTHER SUPPORT



MIDWIVES

received training in Comprehensive Emergency Obstetric and Newborn Care (CeMonC) in Al Dhale'a in coordination with Ministry of Public Health and Population.



FIRST AID TRAINING

sessions were conducted for 210 weapon bearers and 10 healthcare workers.

PHYSICAL REHABILITATION PROGRAMME



3,800

FACE SHIELDS

were produced by skilled technicians with innovative designs and were distributed to ICRC supported health facilities.



WHEELCHAIR CLINIC

was initiated in Sana'a in cooperation with the Rehabilitation Fund and Care for Handicapped (RFCHP) offering quality clinical service.



200

PRP SERVICES

were given to people in remote and vulnerable areas as an outreach programme done by the ICRC PRP teams in Sana'a, Sa'ada, and Aden.

SERVICES

were provided in the ICRC-supported physical rehabilitation centers (PRCs) in 5 governorates.



PRP DEVICES

including 931 prostheses, 31,049 orthoses, 3,627 walking aids, 121 wheelchairs and 14,063 physiotherapy treatment, were produced in 5 ICRC-supported PRCs.



WITH DISABILITIES

referred to support from EcoSec pertaining to their economic vulnerability.

LITERS OF WATER

were donated and distributed to 6 central prisons through the emergency water trucking response.



BOREHOLE

was drilled (400m deep) and 3 other boreholes were supported with wall construction.



SOLAR PANELS

were donated to diffrent water supply projects to ensure sustainable water supply.



WATER NETWORKS

were supported with maintenance work, spare parts, and tools to ensure access to safe water.



SUBMERSIBLE PUMPS

were installed in 9 mosques, along with 3 submersible pumps motors and 3 pump petrol engines that were donated to a branch of the Local Water and Sanitation Corporation.

COOLANTS

were donated by the ICRC to Mokha Local Water and Sanitation Corporation to the operating wells to ensure sustainable safe water supply.



FILTERS

were donated to different facilities to support the sustainability of energy and therefore ensure safe water supply.





OF FUEL

were donated to 8 Local Water and Sanitation Corporations to operate boreholes. Also, installed a 5,000L fuel tank to one local water facility and built one metallic room for fuel reservoir for another.



GENERATORS

were donated by the ICRC in 3 Local Water and Sanitation Coperations and 12 other Local Coperations were supported with consumable spare parts, lubricant oil and maintenance services.



HEAVY DUTY MACHINES

were donated to different Local Water and Sanitation Corporations and one other Local Water and Sanitation Corporation was supported with maintenance to heavyduty machines.



SEWAGES

rehabilitation interventions were done in 5 prisons and an orphanage along with donating 6 mobile sewage pumps with their spare parts and accessories to a branch of the Local Water and Sanitation Corporation.



CHLORINE TABLETS

were donated to health facilities and the Local Water and Sanitation Corporation, along with 1,440kg of chlorine powder, 110 WATA test reagent kits, 90 chlorine makers, 20 chlorine makers, and 25kg of sodium hydroxide.

TARPAULINS

were donated to cover the yard of Al-Turbah Ash Shabka Prison from the sun in order to enhance the outing area.



QUARANTINE PLACES

were supported with different materials such as water tanks, Grifaid Family Aqua filter, tent, cleaning tools, and steel waste bins.





YRCS BRANCHES

were supported with infrastructure rehabilitation.



LOCAL WATER & SANITATION CORPORATIONS

were supported with IT equipments such as main server, computers, network points, etc.



SHELTERS

(90m²) were donated and installed to host 380 migrants in Sa'ada City.

PROTECTION OF THE CIVILIAN POPULATION



FORMER DETAINIEES

were released and transferred back home as part of the largest release operation the ICRC facilitated in several decades.



FAMILY LINKS

were restored through the distribution of 1'080 Red Cross Messages and 303 brief oral messages as well as the facilitation of 102 phone calls.



MINORS

were reunified with their family members following family tracing and 89 family members of reunified minors were supported with financial assistance.



PLACES OF DETENTION

around the country were visited by the ICRC to ensure that the detainees are afforded adequate living conditions, are able to contact their families, and are treated at all time with dignity.



UNIDENTIFIED BODIES

were temporarily buried by the concerned authorities with the technical support of the ICRC.



REFRIGERATED TRUCKS

were donated to the Yemen Red Crescent Society (YRCS) to ensure the dignified management of the dead.



PERSONS

from YRCS volunteers, weapon bearers, Military Health Services Circle, and Martys Foundation were trained by the ICRC on Dead Body Management.



MISSING PEOPLE'S Fate

were clarified by the ICRC.
