

Together with the South Sudan Red Cross, the ICRC responds to the urgent needs of the communities most severely affected by armed conflict and situations of violence. With offices in the Equatorias, Wau, Jonglei, Upper Nile, Bentiu and Unity states, South Sudan remains the ICRC's largest operation on the African continent.

In response to people's most **urgent needs** and to help build the **resilience** of the displaced, the ICRC and the South Sudan Red Cross (SSRC) have:



Distributed more than **1,600,000** food rations
 Provided household essentials for **600,000** people
 Provided nearly **677,000** people with seeds and tools for farming
 And over **234,000** with fishing kits



Vaccinated more than **1,000,000** heads of livestock
 Treated **200,000** animals, benefitting nearly **460,000** people
 Trained over **400** community animal health workers and provided them with drugs



Ensured access to safe drinking water for over **615,000** resident and displaced people through the rehabilitation of **490** water infrastructures
 Installed emergency water units benefitting more than **176,000** people in response to the cholera outbreaks in 2014 and 2015

To support access to **health** and surgical care the ICRC has:



Performed nearly **8,000** surgeries
 Conducted more than **182,000** outpatient consultations
 Provided medical materials to **75** first-aid and other health-care facilities



Provided antenatal care for **6,700** women, safe deliveries for nearly **500** and more than **12,500** vaccine doses for children under one year old



Assisted nearly **5,600** people with disabilities
 Evacuated **965** war-wounded patients

Through visits to places of **detention**, the ICRC supports authorities to adhere to international standards:



Visited more than **5,700** detainees throughout the country
 Improved living conditions for **5,350** detainees
 and implemented preventive measures against cholera

To help **reconnect family members** separated by the conflict the ICRC and SSRC have:



Facilitated nearly **30,000** phone calls between family members separated by the conflict
 Distributed more than **5,600** Red Cross messages



Reunited **84** children and vulnerable people with their families.

To promote knowledge and respect for **International Humanitarian Law**, the ICRC has:



Trained over **4,200** weapon bearers, from both sides of the conflict, on IHL and **837** weapon bearers, police and fire fighters in first aid and safe access to health care.
