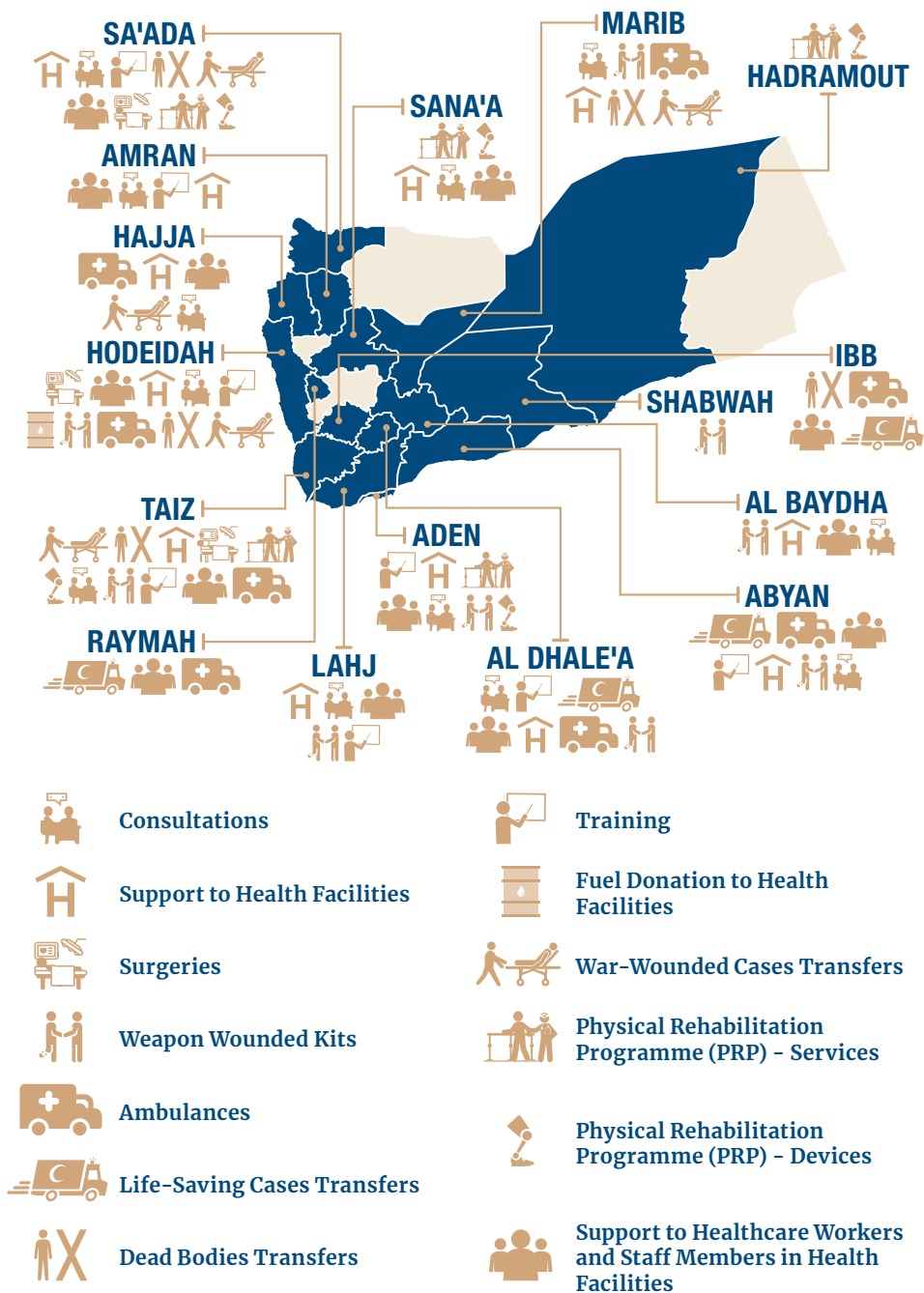

ACCESS TO HEALTH CARE AND MEDICAL FACILITIES

ACTIVITIES PER GOVERNORATE





1.77 Million

CONSULTATIONS

were carried out in Primary Health Centers (PHCs), hospitals, and dialysis centers supported by the ICRC.



46

HEALTH FACILITIES

(15 hospitals and 31 PHCs) were supported regularly with medical & non-medical supplies, including medicines, medical equipment, PPEs, hygiene materials, stationery, of which three dialysis centers were supported with dialysis materials & consumables.



38

HEALTH FACILITIES

(33 hospitals and 5 PHCs) were supported for emergencies on an ad hoc basis with provision of medical equipment, medicines and medical consumables, war-wounded kits, hygiene materials, PPEs and fuel.

SURGERIES

were performed in all hospitals supported by the ICRC.

HEALTHCARE WORKERS AND STAFF MEMBERS

in different health facilities across the country were supported with monthly incentives.

attended ICRC-supported capacity building trainings on different thematics, such as first aid, monitoring and on-the-job training field visits, pharmacy & stock management, infection control, midwifery, among others, in order to improve the quality of health care services.

HOSPITALS

with a total capacity of 680 surgical beds, 20 operation tables, 36 ICU beds, and 12 emergency room beds were supported with weapon wounded kits.

AMBULANCES

were donated to Yemen Red Crescent Society (YRCS) branches to support the referral system, while another **29 ambulances** (28 of which belongs to the YRCSs and 1 to the Sumarah Emergency Center) were supported with fuel and maintenance.



361,400 liters

OF FUEL

were donated on a regular basis to 4 hospitals to ensure reliable electricity production, and one hospital was supported with **12,000 liters of petrol** for its ambulances.

were transferred by the YRCS with the support of the ICRC.

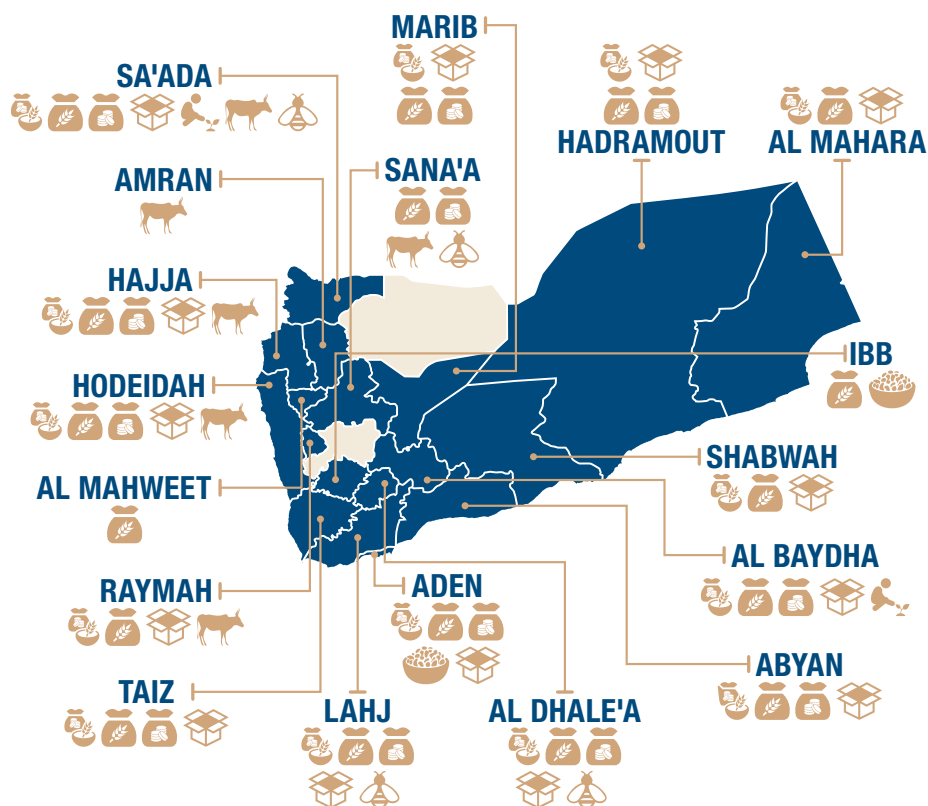

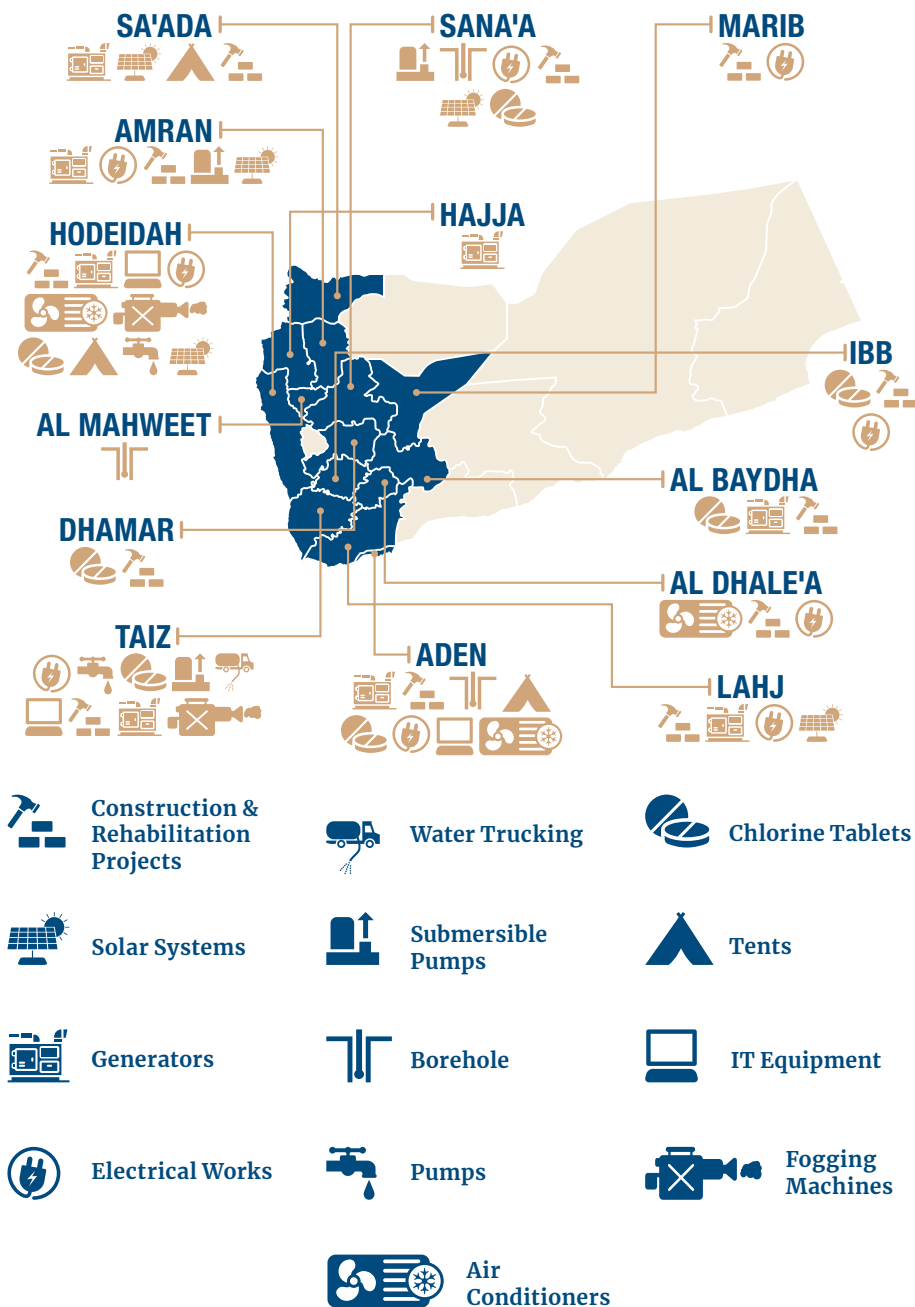

CONSTRUCTION & REHABILITATION PROJECTS

(including mechanical repairs, electrical works, water, and sanitary work, civil work) were conducted by the ICRC in 17 health facilities, 8 water projects/ Local Water and Sanitation Cooperation branches, 4 detention facilities, 3 YRCS branches, and an IDP camp.



72

ELECTRICAL WORKS

were carried out in 11 water projects/Local Water and Sanitation Cooperation branches, 21 health facilities, and 6 different local facilities. The electrical works included the donation of generators, solar systems, spare parts, UPSs, lead-acid batteries, electrical cables, and combiner boxes along with rehabilitation and maintenance work to ensure a sustainable source of electricity.

GENERATORS

with a total power of 1,567KVA were donated to different water projects, Local Water and Sanitation Cooperation branches, prisons, and health facilities.

SUBMERSIBLE PUMPS

were donated to 3 water projects and a detention facility. In addition, a branch of the Local Water and Sanitation Cooperation was supplied with control panels for 15 submersible pumps.



20

TENTS

were donated to 3 health facilities for isolating COVID-19 patients and for screening patients coming into the facility.

SOLAR SYSTEMS

were donated and installed at a health facility, a prison, and a YRCS branch. While 3 other solar systems were supported with expansion to its grid with new solar panels or inverters.



3 million

LITERS OF WATER

were donated and distributed to a prison and a hospital through the emergency water trucking response.

BOREHOLE

benefited from construction and rehabilitation work, pumping tests, chemical and biological tests, and one local water and sanitation corporation was supported with borehole camera, battery, screen, and cable 600m.

benefited from the ICRC-donated ArcGIS tools to be used as a decision-making tool to plan for timely and efficient interventions in 3 Local Water & Sanitation Corporation branches.

were donated to different facilities along with safety materials to get access to safe and disinfected water and to implement chlorination against cholera and COVID-19.

DETAINEES

in 25 prisons across the country benefited from donations of personal hygiene and general cleaning items, clothes as well as recreational and educational items to support authorities in their 'duty of care' for humane conditions of detention and treatment of detainees.

VISITS

to 4 detentions facilities to evaluate the ICRC Health Care in Detention (HCD) project to improve access to healthcare services by more than 7,200 detainees.

DETENTION VISITS

to 16 places of detention around the country to ensure that the detainees are afforded adequate living conditions, are able to contact their families, and are treated at all times with dignity.

MINORS

were reunified with their family members, all of whom were supported with financial assistance.



801

FAMILY LINKS

were restored through the distribution of 632 Red Cross messages, 58 brief oral messages as well as the facilitation of 111 phone calls.

HOSPITALS

were supported with provision of incentives to mortuary staff for the dignified management of COVID-19 related deaths.

were clarified by the ICRC and **5 human remains** were transferred back to their party of origin.

attended trainings on different thematics such as; detention management, forensic dentistry, forensic human identification, dignified management of the dead, and the use of personal protection equipment (PPE) while handling COVID-19 related deaths.

were provided in 9 health facilities the NorCross supported with incentives for health workers and staff members, running cost, medical supplies, medicine, rehabilitation works, fuel, and maintenance.

received health care services in a hospital, a dialysis center, and 4 YRCS Health Centers the GRC supports with incentives for staff members, medicine, medical solutions, medical equipment, running costs, and rehabilitation works.

benefited from 9 wells, a rainwater harvesting tank, and 5 traditional ponds that the GRC provided with solar systems and rehabilitation works.
