



Support to the conflict affected population

5,125 individuals from 28 conflict affected communities benefitted from RASB sessions and Forum theatres which allowed them to increase resilience to mine risks and weapon contamination.

272 construction workers and **55** MoES firefighters increased their resilience to mine risks and weapon contamination hazards, and adopted safer behavior through RASB sessions.

373 information and 44 supervision sessions were held with the psychologists supporting children with complex trauma.

357 persons received direct MHPSS support in relation to complex trauma.

215 children in kindergartens in 5 conflict affected communities benefitted from distribution of toys and play materials.

198 individuals repatriated by the authorities from the Middle East have benefitted from financial assistance.

116 households in 5 conflict affected communities participated in a beekeeping training and **73** of them received relevant tools, bee colony, beehives and medicines.

65 individuals in 11 conflict affected communities have benefitted from referral and advocacy activities.

36 school and kindergarten teachers in 7 conflict affected communities participated in Child Safeguarding training co-facilitated with SOS Children's Villages Azerbaijan.

26 psychologists participated in training on providing psychological support to children with complex trauma.

19 Red Cross Messages were exchanged between persons stranded abroad and their relatives in Azerbaijan.

3 Primary Health Care facilities (serving 15 patients per day on average, per facility) located in conflict affected communities were rehabilitated through the ICRC support.

Persons missing in relation to the conflict

700 biological reference samples were collected from 303 families of missing persons from the 90s conflict to facilitate future identification of human remains.

47 family members received psychosocial support during the process.

7 supervision sessions were provided to the accompaniers supporting the family members of missing during the collection of biological reference samples.

Over **53** representatives from various national entities involved in efforts to clarify fate and whereabouts of missing persons benefitted from three five-day courses – Advanced Field Recovery, Basic Osteological Analysis, and Forensic Archeology Sensitization.

Authorities and Academic circles

1,091 officers and cadets of the MoD participated in IHL trainings.

159 legal professionals (judges, candidates to Bar Association) participated in presentations on IHL and judicial guarantees.

113 students benefitted from extra-curricular activities on IHL (guest lectures, moot-courting, study visit).

105 mid-senior army officers benefitted from one-day training on IHL.

45 officers of MoD, SSS and Penitentiary Service participated in a seminar on the treatment of detainees within the framework of IHL.

25 middle management level officials of different governmental institutions participated on the dissemination session on IHL.

20 officials participated in the briefing session on the ICRC mandate and activities.

16 journalists have increased their knowledge on the ICRC mandate and activities through a briefing session.

11 representatives of the Ministry of Justice participated in a seminar on "Repression of IHL Violations".

10 representatives of national entities have benefitted from study tours organized abroad on different topics.

Detention

45 visits to **22** places of detention were conducted to monitor conditions of detention, treatment, access to healthcare and judicial guarantees.

9,000 hygienic parcels were delivered to the most vulnerable detainees through the Penitentiary Service.

10 prison doctors participated in a training organized in collaboration with MoJ MMD and MoH in order to provide psychiatric care to detainees with mental disorders.

Health care

74 students and school staff in 3 conflict affected communities benefitted from first aid training and donation of 83 individual first aid kits.

16 ANAMA ambulance staff benefitted from FA training, and donation of FA items and consumables.

15 health staff, including 5 ambulance staff, from 9 districts and cities benefitted from FA training.

10 ambulance staff from 7 districts and 2 ANAMA staff benefitted from Basic Emergency Care course.

4 ambulance staff from 4 districts and 2 ANAMA staff benefitted from Training of Trainers on Basic Emergency Care.

Cooperation with AzRCS

89 AzRCS volunteers received Data Collection training with Device Magic application to help them improve capacity and skills in data collection.

86 volunteers participated in Safer Access sensitization sessions.

24 AzRCS volunteers enhanced their dissemination skills through a two-day communications training and increased their knowledge on IHL and rules of use of emblem.

17 volunteers benefitted from Movement Orientation Course.

14 AzRCS volunteers received briefing on RFL and strengthened their knowledge of cooperation between AzRCS and ICRC in terms of referrals and the search for missing persons in different contexts.

28 FA posts were conducted by the AzRCS volunteers in conflict affected communities **12** volunteers participated in First Aid Training of Trainers.

AzRCS volunteers from **5** district branches have tested their emergency response skills in simulation exercises.
