ECONOMIC ASSISTANCE

Over **200,000 people**, including about 7,000 displaced persons and about 320 tuberculosis patients, received food parcels and hygiene kits. Over **12,000 people** in 15 temporary accommodation centers benefitted from bulk food, hygiene items, dishware, bedding to improve their food consumption and living conditions. **9 IDP centers** in 4 settlements benefitted from bedding and household appliances to improve their capacity to serve as a temporary shelter for people.

Some **12,000 patients** in 4 health care facilities received diapers and bedlinen. **16 hospitals** benefitted from essential household items. **4 social protection institutions** and **1 nursing home** in Mariupol received household appliances, furniture and bedlinen to improve their services for vulnerable people. **7 veterinary hospitals** received equipment to improve their work on artificial insemination and vaccination for farming animals.

10,000 children in 508 schools received school kits with stationery items.

Over **12,000 tons of coal** were delivered to over **4,850 households** in 9 settlements near the frontline to ensure they can heat their homes during the winter period. More than **15,000 blankets** were donated to about **13,000 households** in 5 settlements. 4 local administrations were provided with chain saws as part of the winterization program and improving capacity of communities. Around **2,200 families** in 7 settlements received candles and torches due to a power outage.

HEALTH CARE

9 primary healthcare and **6 hospitals** along the frontline received medicines for the treatment of chronic diseases, dressing materials, disinfection and sanitary items on regular basis. **18 primary healthcare facilities** received medical equipment, **27 hospitals** received surgical disposables and medical equipment to face emergencies, **29 medical facilities** received infection prevention and control kits.

30,000 tests and reagents for checking infections in donor's blood and **27,000 blood bags** were donated to Blood Centers in Donetsk, Gorlovka, Yenakievo. **3,000 patients with diabetes** (type 1) received **52,000 vials of insulin**. Over **2,050 diabetic patients** received glycated hemoglobin tests supported by the ICRC. **1,500 books** "Management of Diabetes Mellitus" were provided to Donetsk Medical University as well as **33,000 leaflets** on diseases prevention for patients.

316 people with disabilities benefitted from transportation services supported by the ICRC. **805 people** received wheelchairs, walking aids as well as a pair of custom-made orthopedic footwear. 6 wheelchairs and 6 crutches were donated to hospitals.

WATER AND RECONSTRUCTION

Around **72,000 people** residing in **24,000 households** in 13 settlements located near the frontline received tarpaulins and plastic sheets as a temporary measure to cover damage to their houses. Around **800 people** residing in **255 households** in 4 settlements received construction materials such as roofing sheets, timber, bricks, and cement. **182 people** benefited from rehabilitation of **80 damaged houses** and 1,100 PVC windows were installed to rehabilitate houses damaged by the conflict.

4 medical facilities, 1 hospital in Novoazovsk and **Medical Legal Bureau** facilities were rehabilitated and equipped to improve their services. **1 education complex** in Stepanovka village was rehabilitated and **2 schools** benefited from the replacement of PVC windows. 48 generators were delivered to social infrastructure facilities to cope with emergency situations.

Over **41,000 people** benefited from **850,000 liters** of drinking water to cope with an emergency with the water supply in Donetsk, Mariupol and 8 more settlements. **80,000 liters** of bottled water were delivered to schools in Volnovakha. Over **7,500 people** in **25 healthcare facilities** in 6 localities benefited from emergency repair materials and about **500,000 liters** drinking water.

1,500,000 people benefited from water networks repair. 2 transformers for the restoration of power supply, 23 vehicles, 35 pumps, tools and equipment to increase the capacity of repair teams of Voda Donbassa company were donated by the ICRC.

ACCESS TO EDUCATION

305 children in kindergartens of Telmanovo, Starolaspa and Uglegorsk were provided with chairs for educational facilities.

60 children in Uglegorsk kindergarten received educational and stationery items.

75 students of Rozovka Art School of Shakhtyorsk district benefited from musical equipment.

129 pupils of the educational complex in Stepanovka village received furniture and kitchenware.

250 students in Novoazovsk Industrial College benefited from furniture for a computer class.

MINE RISK AWARENESS

849 children in 2 schools and 4 educational institutions in Donetsk learned about mine risks and safer behavior via online sessions facilitated by Yunost Cultural Center supported by the ICRC. Over **10,000 safety leaflets** and **20,000 bookmarks** were provided for children to raise their awareness about risk of mines.

1,550 mine risk awareness signs and 1,400 wooden poles, 4 risk awareness billboards, **77,000 m of marking tapes**, technical equipment and tools were donated to relevant structures responsible for humanitarian demining activities to mark dangerous areas and reduce exposure of civilians to mines.

CARING FOR THE DEAD

14 forensic facilities were supported with personal protective equipment, 6 stand-alone refrigerators, equipment and body bags to ensure adequate forensic work and the dignified management of the dead.

1 DNA laboratory was supported with reagents for examination of unidentified dead bodies.

2 institutions received personal protective equipment and body bags, **1 institution** received 2 vehicles to conduct field work, as well as special and auxiliary equipment used in the proper search and recovery of human remains.

PROTECTION

308 civilians affected by the hostilities received financial assistance to cope with their expenses.
