FACTS & FIGURES



1.5 million meals to the asylum seekers at the berm and the transit sites of Hadalat, Bustana and Ruwayshid, along with clothes, blankets, hygienic items and other essentials, together with the Jordan Red Crescent Society (JRCS).



Water projects benefitting 150,000 Jordanians and Syrians in North Badia, as well as trucking of 28,000 m³ of drinking water to the berm and the transit sites of Hadalat, Rukban, Bustana and Ruwayshid.



Medical consultations to 63,000 asylum seekers at the berm, in Ruwayshid transit site and at the ICRC clinic in Raba'a Al Sarhan Registration Centre.



Phone calls for 30,000 Syrian refugees in Zaatari and Azraq camps to maintain contact with family members in Syria and elsewhere, with support from JRCS volunteers.



800 travel documents to refugees granted resettlement in third countries.



Individual visits to 530 detainees in 11 detention places and exchanging 450 Red Cross messages and 120 oral greetings (salamat) between them and their relatives.



Cash grants to 3,000 Syrian families (the majority of whom are headed by women) in Mafraq and Madaba governorates, in cooperation with the JRCS.



International Humanitarian Law courses to 2,500 members of the armed and security forces, national authorities, academics, Islamic charitable organizations and non-State armed groups involved in the Syrian conflict.



Shipping of 300,000 relief items to Syria, Yemen and Libya, including hygienic kits, blankets and mattresses.



27 training courses to 500 ICRC staff members from the Middle East, Libya, Europe, West Asia and the USA.
