

HANDOUT 5: REPORTING ON ARMED CONFLICTS: WHO IS PROTECTED BY IHL?

MILITARY/PARAMILITARY FORCES, ORGANIZED ARMED GROUPS OF A **CIVILIANS** PARTY TO CONFLICT they are protected from being attacked they cannot be attacked when they are hors de combat: wounded, sick, shipwrecked, detained or surrendering EVEN in case of doubt, they have to be considered civilians they are protected against specific means and methods of warfare even while fighting BUT, if they take direct part in hostilities, they may temporarily lose their protection from being directly targeted and can be in international armed conflicts, members of prosecuted for doing so. military/paramilitary forces are called combatants and cannot be prosecuted for lawfully fighting

DETAINED PERSONS

- must be treated humanely, and their lives and dignity must be preserved
 (they are protected in particular against murder and against torture and other cruel, humiliating or degrading treatment)
- must be provided with suitable food, shelter and medical care
- must be allowed to correspond with their families
- must be protected from public curiosity

In international armed conflicts, detained combatants are entitled to the PRISONERS OF WAR status.
