# International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC)

## Activities Highlights for January-December, 2017

98 staff members working in Baku Delegation and Barda Sub Delegation

### Economic Security

**2349**

Individuals (522 households) from 9 frontlines communities received various inputs to improve their livelihoods.

**1443**

Individuals, including 20 mine victims, (337 households) from 11 frontlines communities saw their family income increase and/or their living conditions improve thanks to cash transfer for MEI, CfW and unconditional cash grants.

Mines

### Weapon Contamination

**1746**

Individuals in 26 communities were briefed on safer behavior during conflict situations. 826 posters and a billboard on threats posed by mines and ERWs, were distributed.

**1521**

Individuals benefited from 3 community shelter, 2 safer play areas and 18 protective walls to reduce their exposure to risk



### Cooperation with AzRCS

**134**

AzRCS volunteers participated in various activities on first aid, emergency response, IHL, psychological first aid, and dissemination skills.

**14**

AzRCS volunteers from frontline branches participated at First Aid Training of Trainers Course.



### Detention

**222**

RCMs were collected and distributed .

**68**

Visits were carried out to 25 places of detention to monitor treatment and conditions of detention and to support family contacts.



### Humanitarian protection

**6907**

Individuals benefited from the ICRC's neutral intermediary role facilitating civilians' safer access to exposed fields to plant, harvest, repair vital infrastructures, and retrieve or transfer the bodies of Azerbaijani servicemen fallen in battlefield



### Water & Habitat

**4336**

People restored or improved their access to water to ICRC support in upgrading the water supply infrastructure. 20 water board operators participated in maintenance training offered by the ICRC.

**2385**

Community members (including 119 pupils in 3 schools) from 4 frontlines communities were briefed on efficient use of water and water supply systems.

**943**

Individuals from 2 frontline communities benefited from an improved access to electricity after rehabilitation of the electrical network, and installation of alternative solar hot water system at one public bathroom by the ICRC.



### MHPSS

**685**

Individuals from 5 frontline communities, including children, adolescents, teachers, and 9 AzRCS volunteers participated in various psychological and psychosocial support activities.



### IHL

**230**

School and university students, and professors benefited from IHL related activities.

**70**

Representatives of authorities (including judges, prosecutors, diplomats) participated in trainings and seminars on IHL.



### Missing in relation to the conflict

**1163**

Relatives of missing people drew psychological support from commemoration events, peer-group sessions or individual home visits.

**1003**

Biological reference samples related to 332 missing persons were collected from their relatives to facilitate future identification of exhumed remains.



### Armed & Security Forces

**1180**

High ranking officers, military servicemen of Peacekeeping Forces, and cadets of the Azerbaijan Higher Military School participated in IHL related activities.

**62**

Officers of MinInt and State Border Service, and Police Directors of temporary places of detention attended in workshops related to International Rules and Standards for Policing.

**35**

Officers were certified as trainers of IHL.



### Health Care

**396**

Individual and community first aid kits were donated to 25 frontline villages.

**320**

Individuals from 25 frontline communities and 14 Azerbaijan Scouts Association volunteers were trained in first aid.

**35**

Paramedics of MoD, and rescuers of MoES were trained in first aid.

**29**

Doctors from MoH operating in frontline communities participated in Emergency Room Trauma Course.
