Terms and Conditions

1. All entries must be submitted by 30 June 2019. Only entries submitted before this deadline will be considered.
2. Entries may only be submitted by students currently registered at accredited higher education institutions in South Africa.
3. Students may enter the competition individually or in teams.
4. Winners will be chosen according to three (3) pre-selected categories, namely: the Poster category; the Animated Video category and the Reference Guide category. Students may enter more than one (1) category should they wish to do so, although doing so will create no additional advantage or incentive.
5. Winners will be chosen by the Pretoria Regional Delegation of the International Committee of the Red Cross, whose decision shall be final.
6. A monetary prize of ZAR10 000 will be granted by the Pretoria Regional Delegation of the International Committee of the Red Cross to the winning entry in each of the pre-selected categories. This prize money shall be used as a contribution towards the studies of the students submitting winning entries. Where a team wins in any of the categories, the prize money will be divided equally among team members.
7. Students who enter this competition agree that should they win in one of the pre-selected categories, the intellectual property rights in respect of their submitted work shall be solely owned by the International Committee of the Red Cross. The International Committee of the Red Cross may use this work in a manner and for a duration that it wishes, and students shall have no claim (financial or other) over such use. In this regard, the students who submit winning entries must enter into a contract with the ICRC regarding ownership of the submitted work, before the monetary prize can be granted.
8. The monetary prizes outlined in point 6 above will be granted to the higher education institutions where the students submitting winning entries are based, and will be granted in the form of bursaries for such students. The monetary prizes shall not be granted to the winners directly. Higher education institutions of participating students agree that should students registered at their institutions win in one of the pre-selected categories, the intellectual property rights in respect of the submitted work shall be solely owned by the International Committee of the Red Cross. In this regard, the higher education institution where the student submitting a winning entry is based must enter into a contract with the ICRC regarding ownership of the submitted work and agreeing to use the monetary prize as a bursary for the students, before the monetary prize can be granted.
9. Students who submit winning entries and who cede their intellectual property rights to their submitted work may still submit their work for other external competitions/awards, with the written permission of the International Committee of the Red Cross.
