Operational update as of 10 December 2012

EMERGENCY RELIEF













Donation of food and kits containing essential items for hygiene, emergency shelter and cooking for 21,000 people (or 3,500 families) in the three worst-hit provinces of Compostela Valley, Davao Oriental and Surigao del Sur.

WATER

In cooperation with the Philippine Red Cross, the ICRC has sent two water purification units to provide clean drinking water in Baganga and Cateel, Davao Oriental.

Pipes and other materials were donated for the repair of the water system in Compostela Valley Provincial Hospital damaged by flash floods. Construction materials were also donated to repair Montevista District Jail.

100 body bags were provided to Philippine Red Cross in Compostela Valley while 50 body bags were sent to Davao Oriental

HEALTH

Medicines and medical supplies were sent to Davao Regional Hospital, which received an influx of nearly 300 patients wounded during the typhoon.

Medicines and medical supplies were also sent to Bukidnon Medical Center and Compostela Valley Regional Hospital.
