

The International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) is an impartial, neutral and independent organization whose exclusively humanitarian mission is to protect the lives and dignity of victims of armed conflict and other violence and to provide them with assistance. In Bangladesh, we work closely with the Bangladesh Red Crescent Society (BDRCS) to deliver life-saving aid and meet the needs of the communities that are affected by violence. We also promote knowledge of and respect for international humanitarian law (IHL).

Here we present the highlights of our activities in 2024.



6 PRISONS, HOSTING OVER **20,000** DETAINEES

were visited to share recommendations confidentially with the responsible authorities



16 HEALTH PROMOTION TRAINING SESSIONS

were conducted for 93 detainees



76 PRISON GUARDS AND 9 HEALTH STAFF

received scabies management and awareness training



02 PRISON PHARMACIES

received medicine storage materials and 3 prisons received medical equipment



36 PRISON MANAGERS

ranking from Senior Superintendent to Deputy Jailor, joined a three-day training on safe and humane prison management including key concepts of health care in detention



435 MISSING PEOPLE'S

fate and whereabouts were clarified



28 HEALTH-CARE WORKERS

at Holy Family Red Crescent Medical College Hospital and 13 health-care professionals from 7 detention place received basic emergency care training



11 HEALTH-CARE PROFESSIONALS

at HFRCMCH received a training for trainers on basic emergency care



48 COMMUNITY MEMBERS

from Bandarban and Khagrachari districts and 30 community health-care providers of Rangamati District received basic first-aid training



96 BDRCS YOUTH VOLUNTEERS

received advanced first-aid training, 30 volunteers joined training of trainers' sessions for advanced first-aid and 30 volunteers from CHT joined training of trainers' sessions on basic first-aid



260 BDRCS FIRST AID VOLUNTEERS

from 9 units deployed during the Student Movement, delivered first-aid support to 1,720 individuals



1,608 PEOPLE RECEIVED MEDICAL CONSULTATIONS

during Bishwa Ijtema (annual religious gathering) from a mobile health team supported by the BDRCS and the ICRC


460 POLICE OFFICERS
