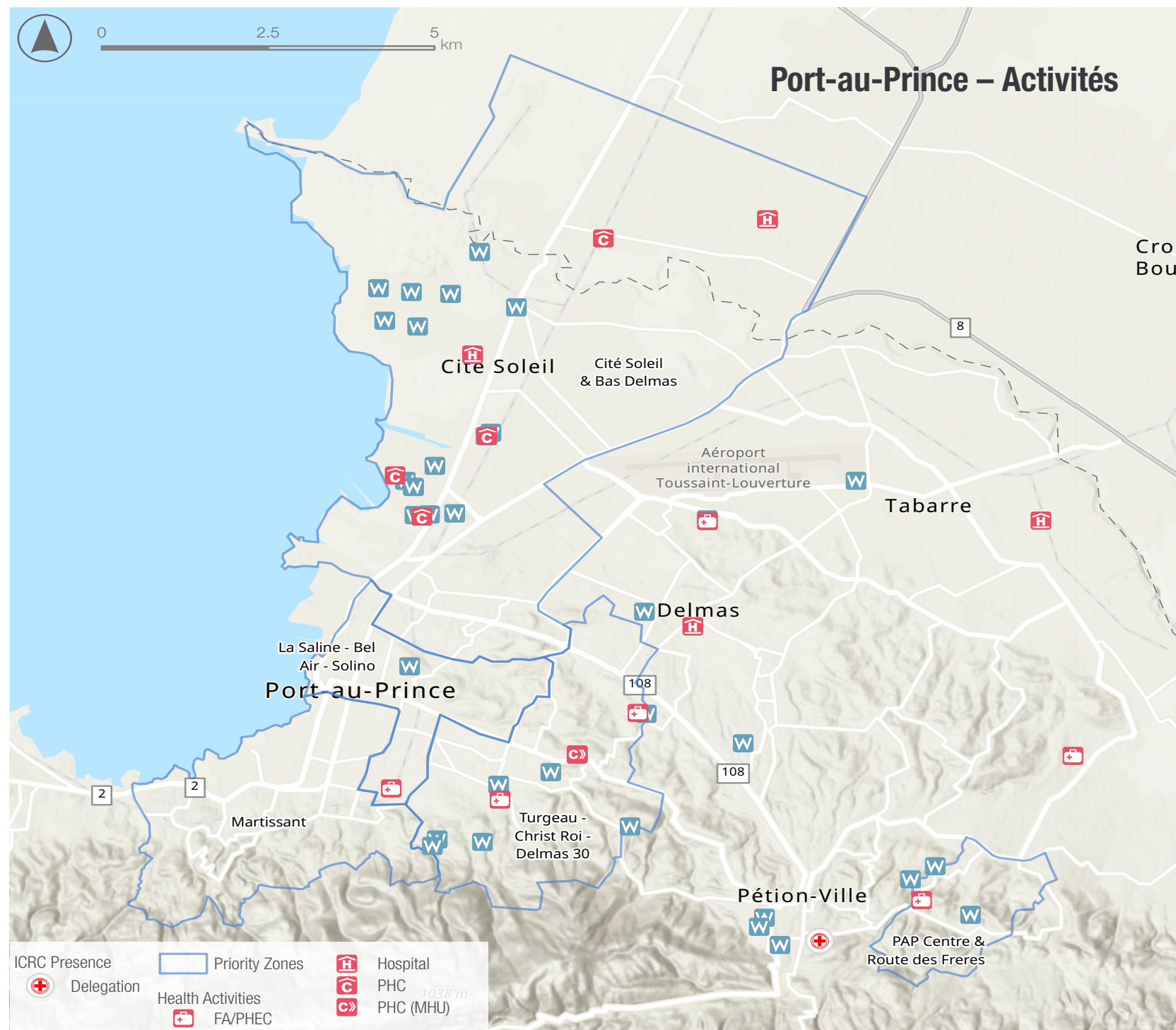

THE ICRC'S ACTIVITIES IN HAITI: JANUARY–DECEMBER 2025



The ICRC is an impartial, neutral and independent organization whose exclusively humanitarian mission is to protect the lives and dignity of victims of armed conflict and other situations of violence and to provide them with assistance. The ICRC also endeavours to prevent suffering by promoting and strengthening humanitarian law and universal humanitarian principles

After 23 years of permanent presence in Haiti, between 1994 and 2017, the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) resumed its activities in the country in 2021, particularly in Port-au-Prince, to help meet the humanitarian needs of the population most affected by armed violence.

The ICRC's activities are focused on protecting the people most affected by armed violence and ensuring their access to essential services, through bilateral, confidential dialogue with armed people and other people involved. This includes raising awareness of the respect for and protection of life, personal integrity, and medical missions

The ICRC supports access to urgent health care by training community first aiders, supporting health-care structures that treat the wounded (including their secure access to water), and supporting medical transport.

Another of the ICRC's focuses in Haiti is strengthening the capacities of the Haitian Red Cross and contributing to the Red Cross Movement's collective response.
