Lebanon Crisis Response Activities

Economic Security

86,135

people benefited from distributions provided by the Economic Security department.

17,227

families received various essential household items (750 blankets, 400 mattresses, 37 tarpaulins and 17,147 hygiene kits).

6

hospitals were supported with essential household items and/or food parcels benefiting 770 people (375 blankets, 124 food parcels, 80 hygiene kits, 355 mattresses).

17,147

food parcels were distributed.



Health

Facilitated **2** separate transfers, each involving **2** trucks, carrying vital biomedical equipment and Intensive Care Unit (ICU) beds from Al Rassoul Al Aazam Hospital to Rafik Hariri University Hospital (RHUH) due to the escalation of hostilities in southern Beirut, to ensure the continuity of critical care, while strengthening the receiving hospital's capacity to manage severe cases amid rising needs.

Provided dressing sets, burn sets, splint sets, first aid kits, medical consumables, and stretchers to the Headquarters of **3** EMS (Rissala, IHS and Civil Defense) providers, and **7** centers reaching **23** centers in affected areas (4 in Beirut, 15 in southern Lebanon, and 4 in the Bekaa) benefiting **2,005** individuals.

Supported **2** hospitals (Tebnin and Marjeyoun Governmental Hospital - Multi-Year Multi-Partners projects) with medical supplies, equipment, and medications, benefiting **1,010** patients, as well as water, food, and essential items for staff. Additionally, hospitalization fees for **5** weapon-wounded patients covered in these 2 hospitals (4 in Tebnin & 1 in Marjayoun).

Supported **16** hospitals through the provision of medical supplies, **7** weapon-wounded kits (covering 350 injured patients) and medications, helping address critical supply gaps benefiting **1,000** patients.

Covered the hospitalization fees of **35** weapon-wounded in **2** ICRC-supported hospitals with no financial guarantor.

Provided donations to **14** PHCs and **1** Mobile Medical Units, benefiting over **30,000** individuals. Supplies included Interagency Emergency Health Kits, acute and chronic medications, consumables, and burn and dressing sets, in addition to insulin and acute medications provided to the mobile medical units of Médecins Sans Frontières – Geneva, to support services in collective shelters (estimated 3,600 beneficiaries).

Donated **649** mobility aids to **3** ICRC-supported physical rehabilitation centers and **2** additional physical rehabilitation center benefiting more than **320** individuals affected by conflict.

Provided medication, medical supplies, and consumables to **10** places of detention, benefiting **6,236** detainees.

Trained **65** psychologists and social workers from the Islamic Health Society (IHS) to provide basic psychological support to more than **2,275** individuals affected by conflicts in shelters across Lebanon (Beirut, Mount Lebanon, southern Lebanon and northern Lebanon).

Water & Habitat

pumping stations, wells and networks supported with donation of fuel or repair/maintenance.

Infrastructure Support to the South Lebanon Water Establishment (SLWE) and Bekaa Water Establishment (BWE)

- Provided fuel support to **124** key water pumping stations across southern Lebanon and the Bekaa valley to help ensure the continuity of water services for over **627,206** people in host communities and collective shelters.
- Provided fuel support to **1** key wastewater treatment plant in southern Lebanon serving around **550,000** people.
- Conducted repairs and equipped **9** water stations across affected areas to respond to increased water demand in host communities affected by displacement.
- Installed generators in 2 water stations in southern Lebanon.
- Conducted repairs on main water distribution lines serving **13** collective shelters hosting **2,427** displaced persons, as well as the host communities in the Jezzine district.
- Repaired water networks destroyed by the conflict in Britel, benefitting **20,000** persons, in Nabi Sheet in the Bekaa valley, benefitting **25,000** persons, and Marjayoun in southern Lebanon, benefitting **18,000** persons.

Systemic Support and Capacity Building for Water Establishments

- Strengthened the preventive maintenance capacity of both the SLWE and BWE to sustain water service delivery, reduce water loss, and improve network efficiency by donating **50** batteries and **5,000L** of engine oil for generators in SLWE, as well as hydraulic crimping tools and **3** electrofusion machines, and provided maintenance for **41** vehicles in BWE.
- Procured **2** additional **20,000L** fuel storage steel tanks to enhance the operational preparedness and response capacity of the SLWE.
- Supported the SLWE's work in collective shelters by donating plastic tanks to **2** collective shelters.

Support Provided to Hospitals

- Provided fuel support to **12** critical hospitals to help ensure the continuity of essential health services, including **35,000L** to the Rafik Hariri University Hospital (RHUH), more than **69,000L** to the Tebnine Governmental Hospital, and more than **176,000L** to **10** hospitals in conflict-affected areas.
- Trucked **396,000 L** of water to support the operational continuity of **1** hospital in southern Lebanon.
- Delivered more than **20,000L** of medical oxygen and **25** oxygen cylinders, and escorted oxygen suppliers to maintain life-saving services in **9** hospitals located in conflict-affected areas.
- Delivered more than **2,500L** of liquefied petroleum gas to maintain life-saving services in **3** hospitals located in conflict-affected areas.
- Conducted repairs in **2** hospitals damaged by the conflict.
- Provided spare parts, pumps, maintenance tools and materials, anti-blast films, electrical accessories, tarpaulins, security lighting equipment, PPEs, as well as generator consumables to strengthen the infrastructure resilience and provide temporary water source to Tebnine Governmental Hospital.
- Donated and installed **1** Reverse Osmosis Unit to Sheikh Ragheb Harb hospital to ensure that hospital staff have access to safe and treated water.
- Installed **1** generator and repaired another in **1** hospital in the Bekaa governorate to sustain hospital operations.
- Transported an X-Ray machine and donated generator consumables to Marjayoun government hospital.

Partnership with the Lebanese Red Cross (LRC) and Palestinian Red Crescent Society (PRCS) in Lebanon

- Provided support to water, sanitation and hygiene (WASH) services and to shelter conditions in **15** collective shelters, supporting internally displaced persons in Aley, Hasbaya, Zgharta, Saida, Beirut, and Rachaya.
- Provided **51,000L** of fuel to the PRCS in Lebanon to support the operation of its clinics and its hospital in the Palestinian camps,

Protection

Protection of Civilian Population

44

cases (individuals and families) received Emergency Cash Assistance.

82

cases related to the conduct of hostilities were documented.

28

real-time interventions were sent to parties to the conflict, highlighting the presence of civilians, essential services, and medical units in areas affected by hostilities.

3

written interventions addressed to the parties to the conflict were sent, drawing attention to obligations under international humanitarian law.

Detention

- **9** detention visits were conducted to places of detention under the authority of the Internal Security Forces, Lebanese Armed Forces, General Security, and State Security to monitor new arrests, assess detention conditions, and evaluate the impact of the conflict on detainees' access to basic needs and essential services.

- **28** Red Cross Messages and Safe & Well services were also provided to detainees, including those transferred following the escalation of the conflict and evacuations from facilities in Dahieh (southern suburb of Beirut) and southern Lebanon.

- Assistance was provided to **12** places of detention as part of the emergency and regular response plan to support authorities in alleviating overcrowding, including the distribution of hygiene items, mattresses, blankets and clothing.

Protection of Family Links

- Evacuated the civil registry files from **4** critical localities in southern Lebanon: Tyre, Jwaya, Marjaayoun and Jbaa.
- Collected **6** tracing requests for persons who went missing in relation to the conflict.
- Conducted **4** visits to shelters hosting vulnerable migrants, to assess the protection needs, including family links, and collect tracing requests for individuals who lost contact with their families abroad, as well as **2** visits to the LRC shelter for the same purpose.

Forensics

- Provided **4,431** body bags to EMS stations and hospitals, deployed **2** temporary cold storage units, assisted in providing **3** additional cold storage units in Beirut and the Bekaa, and facilitated the relocation of **2** others in Beirut and the Bekaa.
- Provided mass fatality management plans to **5** hospitals, conducted a training to the Rafik Hariri University Hospital mortuary team, and assessed the mortuary facilities of **15** hospital mortuary facilities, including their capacities and procedures.
- Provided DNA reagents and consumables to the Ministry of Public Health to enable the scientific identification of **200** cases.

Weapon Contamination

- Conducted awareness sessions and preventive campaigns in communities across affected areas, and distributed educational and awareness materials on safer behavior, explosive risks, and conflict-related dangers, including materials tailored for children.
