## Humanitarian protection

## 3,000

People benefited from the ICRC's neutral intermediary role facilitating civilians' safer access to exposed fields to plant, harvest, and repair vital infrastructures.



# Weapon related risk awareness and safer behaviour

### 2,044

People in 17 FL communities received sessions on risk awareness and safer behavior in case of shooting, shelling, mines or explosive remnants of war. 650 people attended forum theatre on risk awareness and safer behavior delivered in 3 FL communities by trained pupils.

## Missing in relation to the conflict

### 2,118

Biological reference samples related to 757 missing people were collected from their relatives to facilitate future identification of exhumed remains.

# Armed & Security Forces

## 1,620

Servicemen and cadets of AZ army participated in briefings and events related to the ICRC and IHL.

#### 260

High-ranking officers representing different departments of the MoD and deputies of Unit Commanders received presentations on IHL integration into military operations and the ICRC activities.

#### 41

Police officers from FL communities participated in three-day training on International Policing Standards.

#### 16

Deputy Heads of Police Stations from 16 FL districts participated in dissemination session on the ICRC mandate and activities.



## 9,594

People in 12 FL communities received agro or livestock inputs (seeds, fertilizers, subsidization for machine costs) to improve their livelihoods.

#### 205

People in 4 FL communities saw their income increase thanks to cash transfers for MEI and cash for work activities in the agriculture sector.

#### 151

People participated in technical training to gain knowledge on beekeeping or potato cropping.

#### 22

People increased their income in Husanli, Terter thanks to the joint Paid Public works activities organized with MLSPP/DOST agency.

Children/adolescents and 80 teachers from 13 FL communities participated in various psychosocial support activities.

#### 28

Professionals including psychiatrists and narchologists from Narcological Dispensaries, psychologists and social workers participated in 3 trainings on "Mental Health Care in Prisons".

## Detention

RCMs were exchanged between detainees and their families.

Detainees were visited in 38 places of detention to monitor treatment and conditions of detention and to support family contacts.

## Cooperation with the AzRCS

Schoolchildren living in conflict-affected communities were sensitized about History of Red Cross/Red Crescent Movement, Fundamental Principles and its humanitarian activities.

#### 36

First Aid Posts were conducted in 34 FL communities by the AzRCS volunteers where residents were sensitized on First Aid techniques.
