

# FACTS AND FIGURES 2020

## ICRC IN KHARTOUM



The ICRC has been present in Sudan since 1978, helping people affected by the conflict in Darfur, Blue Nile and South Kordofan, and promoting International Humanitarian Law (IHL). Our work today, independently or in cooperation with the Sudanese Red Crescent Society (SRCS), includes supporting hospitals and health facilities with equipment and supplies, working with local water authorities on improving people's access to clean water, and supporting the authorities who provide rehabilitation services for people with disabilities. We provide to displaced people in conflict-affected areas with emergency assistance, distribute seeds and tools to farmers, and vaccinate pastoralists' livestock against diseases. We are helping families separated by conflict or displacement keep in touch with their loved ones, and we have facilitated the release of detainees upon request of the parties and supported the released with some basic assistance as clothes and resources their transport to go home.

### Economic Security



**5,021** households (**27,726** persons) in Al-Jeneina in west Darfur received multi-purpose cash and essential household items (kitchen items, blankets, nets, etc.)



**40** Veterinary technicians and nurses received pre-vaccination refresher training in South and Central Darfur and West Kordofan.



**21,900** households (**159,000** persons) received tools, seeds and food for the protection of seeds. **20** Staff and volunteers from SRCS were trained in Relief and assessment course in Khartoum and Nyala, South Darfur.



**573,235** animals belonging to **11,463** households (**68,778** persons) were vaccinated in West Kordofan, South and Central Darfur. **100** vulnerable returnees' households (600 persons) in Hashaba received donkey carts in Kutum, North Darfur



About **241** metric tons of certified sorghum seeds are expected to be produced following the implementation of multiplication project jointly with Nyala Agricultural Research Centre, Ministry of Agriculture, out growers and women



**147** HHs (**882** persons) with disabilities received cash grants in Zalingei, Nyala and Alfashir, to start small economic activities.



**5** Water Authority technical staff received chlorination training.



**4,600** households (**27,600** persons) in Dubo Al-Omda and Tawila received value vouchers to exchange it with seeds, tools and food.



**18** Households beekeeping producers and **10** Staff from Animal Production Unit department from (MoPER) were trained in Alfashir and received bee-keeping equipments.

## Water and Sanitation



**269,608** people benefitted from construction, upgrading and repairing of water system in urban and rural setting in the States of Blue Nile, Darfur and South Kordofan.



**5** Water Authority technical staff received chlorination training.



In total **305,779** people benefitted from Water and Habitat activities.



**30,000** people benefitted from construction and rehabilitation of **2** clinics.



**10** Sudanese Red Crescent Society volunteers received Hand pump repairing training.

## Health



**35,100** persons benefited from emergency medical supplies donated by ICRC in response to needs from COVID-19 pandemic, intra-communal violence, floods and malaria.



**50,000** people benefited from direct services of medical consultation, midwifery, free of charge medications and health education messages in Feina PHCC in East Jebel Marra.



In response to influx of Ethiopian refugees from Tigray crisis, medical supplies were donated to Hamdayet (PHCC) and Algirba rural hospital in Kassala state, enough to support about **1000** beneficiaries.

## Supporting Persons with Disability



In total **4735** persons with disabilities received rehabilitation services from ICRC supported physical rehabilitation centers.



**1259** received prosthetics devices, among them **94** service users were mine victims.



**630** received Orthotics (support and correction devices).  
**1792** received physiotherapy services.



**87** persons from Ministry of Justice and Sudanese Red Crescent Society (SRCS) participated in communication and IHL trainings conducted by ICRC.



**23** SRCS staff participated in the communication workshop organized jointly by the ICRC and SRCS.



**25** SRCS communication officers attended advanced training in IHL



**10** SRCS officials attended orientation session on IHL teaching for the judiciary.

## Restoring Family Links



**288** tracing requests (format to request a search of family member) were collected.  
**102** tracing requests closed positively.



**591** red cross messages (open letters sent by a person seeking to regain contact with the loved ones) were exchanged.



**14,496** phone calls were facilitated.



**331** anxious for news requests were collected (short message to be delivered by ICRC when a person has no means to contact the family).

## Cooperation with the Sudanese Red Crescent Society (SRCS)



Under the framework of strengthening SRCS capacity to response to emergencies, **1200** volunteers/staff received contingency, visibility and protection materials.



**4** vehicles were repaired, **200** First aid kits were donated.

**3000** volunteers granted global insurance and **4** new emergency action teams were created.

We also seek to prevent hardship by promoting and strengthening humanitarian law and championing universal humanitarian principles.
