112,000

Persons including host communities and IDPs from Mosul and its surroundings have now better access to **water** as a result of rehabilitating and constructing water supply systems.



230,000

persons received **food parcels**, each meets the basic food needs of a family of six for one month.



441,000

persons received **health care** through ICRC support to **28** primary health care centers and **15** hospitals with medicines, equipment, furniture, incentives, capacity building, dressing kits, weapon-wounded kits, first aid training, and physical rehabilitation services.



135,000

persons received **essential household items** including blankets, kitchen sets, basic cookware, jerry cans, kerosene stoves, and buckets.



42,000

detainees were visited to ensure proper treatment and living conditions, **13,181** salamats (greetings) were exchanged between detainees and their families.



4,000

persons including IDPs in camps and residents of retaken areas received awareness sessions on unexploded ordinance.
