ICRC IN SUDAN JANUARY—DECEMBER 2021



Hundreds of vulnerable communities access to clean water in Garsila— central Darfur 2021

The ICRC has been present in Sudan since 1978, helping people affected by the conflict in Darfur, Blue Nile and South Kordofan, and promoting International Humanitarian Law (IHL). Our work today, independently or in cooperation with the Sudanese Red Crescent Society (SRCS), includes supporting hospitals and health facilities with equipment and supplies, working with local water authorities on improving people's access to clean water, and supporting the authorities who provide rehabilitation services for people with disabilities. We provide to displaced people in conflict-affected areas with emergency assistance, distribute seeds and tools to farmers, and vaccinate pastoralists' livestock against diseases. We are helping families separated by conflict or displacement keep in touch with their loved ones, and we have facilitated the release of detainees upon request of the parties and supported the released with some basic assistance as clothes and resources their transport to go home.

## Water and Sanitation



**332,501** people benefited from construction, upgrading and repairing of water systems in urban and rural settings in Darfur and Blue Nile. With these interventions, priority was given to the prevention of water-borne diseases. For example, in Nyala and Al Roseires where chlorination systems were installed.



**1** Master plan for Al Roseires town water supply system was finalized and **5** Water Authority technical staff participated to its final workshop.



**9,000** people benefited from urgent support with chemicals for water treatment in Eastern Sudan during the rainy season.



**126** SRCS volunteers participated on trainings in water chlorination and hygiene promotion in Darfur and Blue Nile.



**6** Health structures (clinics or hospitals) benefited from rehabilitation works in Darfur, Blue Nile and Eastern Sudan. These rehabilitation works involved construction, water supply, sanitation and electrification by solar systems.



**2** Places of detention received infrastructural support in water, sanitation and hygiene in Darfur and Blue Nile. Maintenance support was also provided to two places of detention in South Kordofan.



## International Humanitarian Law



**40** IHL trainings in Kassala, Gadaref, North, Central and West Darfur, Khartoum city and Khartoum state with armed groups signatory of the Juba Peace Agreement.



HCiD roundtable with **22** representatives of relevant ministries and institutions to discuss the law for the protection of healthcare, gaps, challenges and steps forward



**6** IHL sessions with Police, Army and Intelligence Services



**Two** IHL trainings with journalists and influencers in Khartoum



**One** IHL training with **18** prosecutors



The ICRC Physical Rehabilitation Program conducted a certified Wheelchair Service Training at Khartoum on .09.2021

## Supporting Persons with Disability



**6,761** services were provided by the **8** PRP supported centres, services included delivery of **1,411** prosthetics, **2021** orthotics, **276** walking aids, **4** wheelchairs and **2,706** physiotherapy services.



**131** of PRP SUs benefited from the Macro Economic Initiative program in Nyala, Alfasher and Zalingei in Darfur.

**69** Service Users (SUs) were referred from the **5** States of Darfur and from West Kordofan State, for rehabilitation services in Nyala Rehabilitation Centre.



**78** Mine victims were served in ICRC supported PRCs in Nyala, Damazine and Kadugli Rehabilitation Centres, the project is funded by UNMAS and implemented by local NGOs in coordination with National Authority for Prosthetics and Orthotics (NAPO) Khartoum.



**16** detainees benefitted from the ICRC PRP in detention project and received physical rehabilitation services.

**47** students are earning the Diploma and BSc. degree in Prosthetics and Orthotics supported by PRP under a tripartite agreement.



**2** refugees from South Sudan received free of charge Physical Rehabilitation services at NAPO Khartoum centre, the cases were referred by SRCS and Danish Red Cross (DRC).



**2** wheelchairs donated to refugees in Hashaba Camp.

**12** technical staff from NAPO Khartoum centre, states Physical Rehabilitation Centres (PRCs) and PRP attended the first blended Wheelchair Services Training Program in collaboration with Mobility India Rehabilitation



Research Centre at NAPO Premises, from 05 to 14 of September, supported by facilitators from both NAPO and PRP for practical practice.

**23** clinical staff from NAPO Khartoum, KCH and States PRCs attended a Club Foot (CP) training at Khartoum Cheshire Home (KCH) from 20.10 to 21.10 conducted by PRP.



**10** participants from Khartoum, Aljazera, Damazine and Nyala were trained for **2** weeks to become coaches for wheelchair through the coordination between and Disability Challengers Organization.

## Economic Security



**264,516** persons (**44,086** households) in Darfur (Central, South, North- Tawila Jebel Mara localities, Nertiti locality) and Blue Nile State (Bau, Kurmuk and Geissan) benefited from ICRC/SRCS seeds, tools and food for seed protection, Value Vouchers to exchange for Agro inputs of their choice from local traders and cash for agriculture to enable them resume or continue their agricultural production. In addition, in collaboration with the Ministry of production and Economic resources (MoPER), ICRC conducted Agro extension training for **80** staff from the Ministry in the **4** States of Darfur and Blue Nile.



**76,666** persons (**12,761** vulnerable households) benefited from the ICRC/SRCS distribution of essential household items (EHI) including of soaps, kitchen sets, buckets, tarpaulins, clothes set, jerry cans, mosquito nets, blankets, hygiene items for women and sleeping mats, in South, Central and North Darfur, Blue Nile and Khartoum states.



**58,968** persons **9,828** households affected by conflict and floods were also assisted with multipurpose cash in Aljenina, Alfao East Sudan, Derang and Abu-Medyan in Blue Nile to be able to cover their basic needs.



**2,823** persons (**427** households) in the ICRC supported physical rehabilitation program in Nyala, Alfashir and Zalingei received MEI grants to continue or start small businesses (**100,000** SDG was provided per family).



**39,000** persons (**6,500** households) received livelihood support through cash transfer program via Hawala and mobile money in Geissan, Bakori, Nertiti, Hashaba, and Tawila



**1,003,319** animals have been vaccinated and treated against the main epidemic diseases in partnership with the Ministry of Animal Health and Fisheries in Darfur, West Kordofan and Blue



**120'398** persons (owners) representing (**20,065** HHs) were supported in Kabkabiya, Mershing, Almalam, Muglad, Debab, Bau, Kurmuk and Geissan (BN).

The above was preceded by pre vaccination refresher training for the ministry staff in the aforementioned areas, **74** vet technician and nurses were trained.



**536** Metric tons of Sorghum seeds and **12.7** metric tons of Foundation seeds is under production in partnership with Nyala agriculture research Centre, (NARS), the Ministry of Agriculture and the community in Nyala.

Total Tracing Requests closed positively: **130**



Minors and vulnerable persons newly registered in Sudan: **64**

Minors reunified with their families **7**



RFL: **56** Red Cross Messages and **44** oral messages/salamats collected across **7** places of detention in Sudan, of which **21+7** were successfully transmitted to date.



RFL: **3** Tracing Requests collected and **78** phone calls (benefiting **68** males, **3** females and **7** juveniles) successfully effectuated in one place of



## Cooperation with the Sudanese Red Crescent Society (SRCS)



Under the framework of strengthening SRCS capacity to response to emergencies, **345** SRCS deployed volunteers received incentives, **800** volunteers received protection and visibility materials, **5** vehicles were repaired, **50** stretchers and **5000** SRCS jackets were supported.



**5** new Emergency Action Teams (EAT) were established.



**88** students from different universities in Khartoum attended IHL session.



**10** SRCS branches received financial support to the human resources and the daily functioning of offices.



**3000** SRCS active volunteers have granted the global insurance.



**3** years Partnership Framework Agreement (PFA) signed with Sudanese Red Crescent Society (SRCS).



**7** annual Project Agreements were signed with SRCS under the umbrella of the PFA.



Under the framework of strengthening SRCS development, **6** branches and HQ improved their internet connectivity through connection to the fiber optic.

## Health



**9300** wounded benefited from the donation of **195** Weapon wounded kit sets to **20** Hospitals



Total of **33108** persons benefited from curative care in the ICRC supported PHCC in Darfur, Blue Nile State, Kassala and Gedaref.



Total of **2849** antenatal care consultations were provided to pregnant women in the ICRC supported facilities while **459** newborn deliveries



In Response to the Covid-19 pandemics Personal Protective Equipment (PPE): **4000** Surgical masks, **5096** Respiratory masks N95, **17** Boots, **49400** Examination Gloves, **156** Heavy duty gloves, **3595** Apron, **80** Hand sanitizer 500 ml, **36** Infra thermometer, **2080** Gown and **4650** Goggles were distributed to primary health care and Hospitals in Area of Responsibilities (AoRs) and in Khartoum
