SUPPORTING HEALTH CARE



HOSPITALS

with capacity of 7,057 beds serving 26 million people are supported through the payment of salaries to 10,483 health workers, running cost and medical supplies



STUDENTS graduated from the 9 Health Institute of Science supported by ICRC: (mainly nurses and midwifes)



PATIENTS mainly victims of unexploded ordinance, were transported to hospitals through ICRC paid taxi system.



DELIVERIES in the 33 ICRC supported Hospitals.



SACHETS

(536 cartons) of Ready to Use Therapeutic Food (RUTF) were donated to Urgun District, Paktika Provincial, and Paktya Regional Hospitals as an emergency response to vulnerable and families affected by the Earthquake.

IMPROVING CONDITIONS OF DETENTION



VISITS

DETAINEES

PROTECTION OF THE CIVILIAN POPULATION



The ICRC continued to monitor the situation affecting the population in Afghanistan. Whenever applicable, concerns can be raised with relevant actors. The ICRC also conducted collective discussions with communities affected by the situation and facing Protection concerns through "tea and talk".

DIGNIFIED MANAGEMENT OF THE DEAD



HUMAN REMAINS

of fighters and civilians retrieved, transferred and returned to their families and communities with the support of the Afghan Red Crescent Society and ICRC-contracted taxi drivers under the Human Remains Transfer Programme.



Salary support for Forensic service providers through a Memorandum of Understanding with the Ministry of Public Health, covering the salaries of 144 Forensic practitioners from 9 Forensic Medicine Departments from January to March 2022.



FORENSIC SPECIALISTS

from 11 Forensic Medicine Departments attended Forensic Specialization Trainings on examination, identification and documentation of human remains organized in Kabul and Jalalabad in cooperation with the Medico-Legal Directorate Kabul.



FORENSIC CAPACITY BUILDING TASK FORCE

created in cooperation with the Medico-Legal Directorate Kabul to reinforce the Forensic capacities countrywide.



PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT

including surgical masks, rubber gloves, boots, body bags and disinfection equipment donated to 11 Forensic Departments involved in the management of human remains.

ASSISTANCE TO COMMUNITIES



VULNERABLE HOUSEHOLDS

(73,530 individuals) received multipurpose cash assistance to meet their basic needs.



FARMERS

households (86,408 individuals) received cash grants for agriculture to restore their livelihood.



CASH

for work project implemented – 208 community workers earned income and up to 9,950 farmers have improved access to irrigation.



PEOPLE

in Kabul, Farah, Herat, Kandahar, Uruzgan, Zabul, Hilmand, Balkh, Kunduz had better electricity supply owing to the donation of 559,649 L fuel and 11,680 L of oil to DABS.



PEOPLE

in Badghshan, Faryab, Samangan, Kandahar, Farah, Helmand, Nimrouz, Badghis, Ghazni, Nangarhar, Kabul, Khost, Parwan, Herat and Qala e Naw got better access to water owing to new or revamped water towers and supply networks, and donation of fuel, oil, chlorine, equipment and spare parts

LITRES

of diesel and 500 lubricant oil were donated to Mirwais Regional Hospital in addition the construction of water chlorination system and 482 different corrective maintenance activities.

received medicines and consumables for managing routine health care services across the country.

of Ready to Use Therapeutic Food were donated to ARCS for further distribution to the families affected by the Earthquake in Paktika and Khost provinces.



ARCS

District Hospital in Kabul received medicines and consumables for managing outpatient department cases.



BLANKETS

5,000 patous for men, 1,000 shawls for women and 900 jackets for children donated to ARCS for earthquake victims in Paktika and Khost.

of routine vaccinations were administered, and 485,186 outpatient consultations were carried out at 47 ARCS-supported health structures.
